

#### A Message from the Pastor

The British have an innate sense of what is proper and improper. They have a fierce sense of justice and fairness. This manifests itself regularly in their reverence for and adherence to "the queue." For those unfamiliar with the term queue, it means a line in which one waits one's turn. For example, waiting in line for movie tickets or waiting in line to be seated in a restaurant or waiting in line to pay for your merchandise in a department store. You don't "break the queue." That is unfair and unjust. You observe it and honor it. Justice demands it.

One summer, after arriving in London, I was waiting in line in a British Post Office to buy some stamps. It was a very long line. A young Brazilian mother with a baby in a stroller came into the Post Office, saw the long line, and immediately went to the front of the line. The other fifty people began grumbling and told her to "Get to the back of the queue." She pretended that she didn't hear the people. But the attendant had seen what she did, and when she came up to his window, he simply told her, "You will have to go to the back of the queue. You cannot jump in front of all of these people who have been waiting to be served." She left the Post Office in a Brazilian huff, but "right order" had



been restored.

In this weekend's gospel parable, Jesus turns things upside down. Frederick Buechner once wrote this piece of advice about reading scripture: "Don't start looking in the Bible for the answers it gives. Start by listening for the questions it asks." Then he goes on to say, "When you hear the question that is your question, then you have already begun to hear much."

The question that found me this week is this—"Are you envious because I am generous?" If my/our parents had a "Three Strikes Rule" when we were growing up, I would not be writing this reflection and, in all likelihood, you would not be reading it. We like to tell ourselves that everything we get or have in life, we worked for. That's a comforting and reassuring thought, even if it is untrue. Look at your belly button. Did you deserve the gift of life? Did you work hard for it or was it simply freely given to you and to me. If it is a case of the latter, welcome to the amazing world of God's grace.

We are perhaps at our most righteous when we get into discussions about welfare and entitlements and immigration reform and overturning DACA. The problem with all of this righteous talking and unmerciful behavior is captured by the prophet Isaiah—"For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord." Thank God that we get not what we deserve but what we need. Thank God not for our "just desserts" but for his mercy."

The vineyard owner deliberately pays those hired last first. Why does he do this? I believe he does it to demonstrate that he is about love and compassion and mercy. Here's hoping that the next time any of us are tempted to apply our sense of justice to all those other people we are observing and judging, that we remember the haunting question of this parable—"Are you envious because I am generous?" And so, we pray in the words of Jay Cormier:





Do not let jealousy or envy, anger or resentment, be a wedge between us and others, but let their success and happiness help us to realize your countless blessings to us, as well

We welcomed Nurse Daniel and Nurse Abigail to our school on Tuesday. Through our partnership with the University of Portland's School of Nursing,




