This year we experience the shortest Advent possible—twenty-two days. A short season seems even shorter. And so, we find an abundance of riches this weekend. It is both the Fourth Sunday of Advent and Christmas Eve all rolled into one. From my limited perspective, it appears as if a hamster put together the liturgical year this time around. Because of this coincidence, I want to focus on the gift of Christmas. So first, Merry Christmas!



Care for creation team Global warming has effects on the carbon cycle....affecting the availability of essential resources like drinking water, energy and agricultural production in warmer regions and leads to the extinction of part of the planets biodiversity. The melting in the polar ice caps can lead to the dangerous release of methane gas that can lead to decomposition of frozen organic material and can further increase the emission of carbon dioxide. Carbon dioxide pollution increases the acidification of the oceans and compromises the marine food chain.



Many of the poor live in areas particularly affected by phenomena related to warming, and their means of subsistence are largely dependent on natural reserves and ecosystemic services such as agriculture, fishing and forestry. Laudato Si' Pope Francis Policies need to be made to ensure that this cycle stops, Check and see how

the representatives in our state are or are not working on issues related to climate change, Let your government officials know how you feel about these issues.

Second, I don't solicit donations via e-mail. The perpetrators of these scams love to prey upon the loyal, the committed, the generous, and the elderly of our community.

Report Scams and Fraud If you get a suspicious call, text or email (for example, requesting your bank account number, instructing you to buy a gift card or promising an expensive prize), or if you, a relative or a friend has given money or financial information to someone you now suspect was a scammer, call 877-908-3360. Make a year-end donation to St. Ignatius. If you are age 72 or older, the IRS requires you to take required minimum distributions each year from your tax-deferred retirement accounts. A qualified charitable donation (QCD) is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA, payable directly to a qualified charity such as St. Ignatius Parish. 
