### A Message from the Pastor

The Italians have a saying—"Dimmi con cui vai e ti dico qui sei." ("Tell me who you walk with and I'll tell you who you are.") Last week, on the First Sunday of Advent, we walked with the prophet Isaiah. For the next two Sundays of Advent, we will walk with another prophet—John the Baptist.

Many paintings of John the Baptist have him pointing to "the Lamb of God." He struggles to get our attention. He wants to help us sharpen our focus, especially during this brief liturgical season. He is adept at directing us to the dwelling places of God in our life and our world. He is, *par excellence*, an Advent figure who reminds us that Advent is a looking time. As another John—John Bell—puts it:

You keep us looking.
You, the God of all space,
Want us to look in the right and wrong places
for signs of hope,
For people who are hopeless,
For visions of a better world that will appear
among the disappointments of the world we know.
So, thank you ... for the looking time.



Good questions are like arrows in a quiver. They invite us to not only look at aspects of our life but to ponder them (i.e. to think deeply about them). Irish singer Carmel Boyle, in her song My Soul's Desire, invites us to Advent looking/pondering through a series of questions. They are like John the Baptist's finger pointing us to places where Emmanuel (God-with-Us) is to be found in our life, in our community, and in our world. Here are some of the questions that Boyle asks.

What is your longing? What is your hope? What is your yearning? What is your song?

What is your calling? What is your hurt? What is your healing? What is your joy?

What is your wisdom? What is your truth? What is your freedom? What is your fire?



Tell me with whom you walk and I will tell you who you are." Carmen

Boyle's questions and John the Baptist's finger all point in the same direction—imagining a world that is not yet but can be. Imagine what it would be like to have broken relationships healed. Imagine tense marriages becoming more loving. Imagine owning fewer things but being more satisfied with them. Imagine what it



would be like with the world at peace. Imagine countries with honest political processes and results. Dream about a renewed natural environment, homelessness being a thing of the past, our country having adequate health care for all. Envision a world were there was no racism, sexism, intolerance, ethnic or religious wars. During Advent we walk with dreamers and visionaries. The figures of our Advent scriptures call us to work to make these dreams a reality.

Dimmi con cui vai e ti dico qui sei. Welcome to our Second Week Advent-ure!




another, in keeping with Christ Jesus, that with one accord you may with one voiceglorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ," Romans 15:5-6.


