A Message from the Pastor

Buckminster Fuller, an American philosopher, once said: "God, to me, it seems is a verb, not a noun." What a challenging way of thinking about and understanding God.

PENTECOST SUNDAY

This weekend we celebrate the feast of Pentecost. Christ makes good on his promise not to leave us orphans. He sent his first disciples the gift of the Holy Spirit and he continues to do that for us today. But how do we know that the Spirit dwells in us and our world? I think a good starting point is to examine the actions of the Holy Spirit.

In the preface of our Second Eucharistic Prayer for Reconciliation, we read about the activity of the Holy Spirit and, consequently, the presence of the Holy Spirit.

Your Spirit changes our hearts: enemies begin to speak to one another, those who were estranged join hands in friendship, and nations seek the way of peace together. Your Spirit is at work when understanding puts an end to strife, when hatred is quenched by mercy, and vengeance gives way to forgiveness.

It is the Spirit Jesus sends us that gives us the ability to understand our baptismal identity, to honor our baptismal commitment, and to live our baptismal mission. It is the Spirit that teaches us how to be faithful to our promises, how to be generous with our time and talent and treasure, how to be gentle with friends and strangers alike, how to be good in word and action, how to be joyful in our living and hopeful in our dying, how to be at peace with ourselves and others, how to be patient and full of courage in the face of life's challenges and occasional disappointments.



It is the Spirit Jesus sends us that gives us the wonderful ability to dream, to imagine, to remember the past and be filled with gratitude, to be aware of the present and invest ourselves whole-heartedly in it, to long for the future and take that next step in hope that will help us realize what only seemed an impossible dream. On this Pentecost weekend, let us take to heart and live the words of Steve Garnaas-Holmes.



However the Spirit works in you, work with that Spirit. However the Spirit bears love in you, let that love grow. If beauty or friendship feed your joy, bathe your heart in those things. If words or silence nourish your peace, give time to them to bless you. If baseball makes you more patient then play baseball. Whatever nourishes the Spirit in you practice, that it may bear fruit.


"Consider the office of consoler which Christ our Lord carries out." -Spiritual Exercise 224 Alleluia, He is Risen, Alleluia!!!
