A Message from the Pastor

What is the image you get of Jesus' character from this weekend's gospel? What four words would you use to describe him in Mark's account of the healing of the man with leprosy? Here are my four—compassion, willing, touch, community. There is no correct or identifiable four words. These just happen to be the ones that stick out to me this time and this year.

SIGN

Jesus hears the plea of the man with leprosy. I read a poem recently that starkly challenged the reader, "Wage peace with your listening." What an idea! We can actually engage in the work of peace by genuinely listening. Jesus listens to the plea of this man. It brings the leper both peace and healing.

Mark says that Jesus had pity on him. Jesus demonstrated compassion. The word compassion describes the ability of someone to "cry out with the suffering or joy of another." The man didn't just suffer from a painful skin affliction but also the consequences of being recognized as a leper. He was cut off from community.

Think of all of those who are, in fact, cut off from us or who we cut off through our attitudes and behaviors. Pastor and poet Steve Garnaas-Holmes asks, "Who are the lepers who beg for our compassion, whom no one will touch? Are they the prisoners, who frighten us, or nursing home folks? Those who are depressed, or transgendered or angry, the drunk mumbling in the



doorstep, the guy with the cardboard sign at the stop-light, the dying, before whom we stutter and stall? The mentally ill, kidnapped from their own minds, that we are afraid to speak to? The kid with piercings, tattoos and blue hair, immigrants who any moment will be hauled off, people who are chronically poor and grumpy about it? Who are we afraid to touch, to be touched by?"

Jesus' reply to the man's plea, "If you will . . " is emphatically, "I do will it. Be made clean." It fills me with great hope to know that Jesus desires my healing. Not only that, Jesus touches me. We don't just touch people with our hands, although our hands can wound or heal. Our eyes and looks can heal or wound. Our words can wound or heal. Our minds and hearts, if they are closed, can wound deeply. If open, they can heal old wounds.

By touching the man with leprosy, Jesus not only heals his affliction. Jesus heals the deeper wound by welcoming him back into community. Jean Vanier, the founder of *L'Arche* communities and Fr. Greg Boyle, SJ, the founder of *Homeboy Industries*, both talk about the healing power of kinship and community.

Lent begins this coming week on Valentine's Day/Ash Wednesday. What an unusual but fortuitous convergence of celebrations. Valentine's Day celebrating the love between people. Ash Wednesday beginning a forty-day period when love is on retreat and deepening its ability to imitate the love of the Teacher through the time-honored practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. May our observance of these days transform us and open our minds, our eyes and our hearts to the God who dwells deeply in those we dismiss all too easily. And so, we pray, in the words of Jay Cormier:



Saving God,
in your compassion we are made whole;
in your mercy we are restored to joy.
Illuminate our hearts
that we may not see others as lepers
but welcome them as sisters and brothers in you.
In the love and care we extend to others,
let others see your love and care
through which we have been made
"clean" and "whole."
