

A Message from the Pastor



This gospel prompted me to watch an early short silent film by Laurel and Hardy. It's called Big Business. In it, they are Christmas tree salesmen trying to make a living by going door to door selling Christmas trees. One of the great antagonists in this and other films is James Finlayson—a short, bald Scotsman with sideburns, who is an Olympic scowler at our two salesmen.

Finlayson doesn't want a Christmas tree but Laurel and Hardy keep ringing his doorbell because either the tree or Stan Laurel's coat gets caught in the door jam every time Finlayson tells them to "beat it" and slams the door in their



faces. Finally, the infuriated Finlayson takes some branch cutters and surgically cuts their Christmas tree in pieces. Retaliation after retaliation leaves Laurel and Hardy's car and Finlayson's house, furniture, trees and gardens utterly destroyed. This is the world of tit for tat. This is the land of the Hatfields and McCoys. This is a preview of a community and world without forgiveness or mercy.

#### Pastor's Message continued from page one:

Pastor and poet, Steve Garnaas-Holmes, describes what forgiving is all about.

Forgiving is not forgetting bad behavior, not condoning or excusing or minimizing it, not pretending that it didn't hurt, that "it was nothing."

Forgiving is accepting what is that they have wronged you without desire to amend that, to get even, exact payment or get them to see your hurt. It is accepting that the hurt is real, and yet your love for them, and yourself, remains.

Forgiving is letting go of the past, letting the hurt be in the past instead of the present, choosing to stop hanging on to it, stop being chained up in it.

Forgiving is getting free.

We choose to be in the heaven of infinite forgiving rather than the hell of unfinished and never-ending resentment.

Forgiving is coming alive, and entering into eternal life.

Forgiving is not a chore or obligation. Forgiving is joy, freedom, compassion, and peace. Seven times seventy times.

Jan Richardson reminds us that forgiveness is the hardest blessing. The heart of forgiveness is not to be found in excusing harm or allowing it to go unchecked. It is to be found, rather, in choosing to say that although our wounds will change us, we will not allow them to forever define us. Forgiveness does not ask us to forget the wrong done to us but instead to resist the ways it seeks to get its poisonous hooks in us. Forgiveness asks us to acknowledge and reckon with the damage so that we will not live forever in its grip.

Sometimes we are given the grace to forgive quickly. Sometimes the grace to forgive takes a long, long time to receive. And so forgiveness often requires practice. It takes choosing to work at it. We might have to chip away at it again and again and again. Seventy-seven times, at least, as Jesus says in this passage.

Forgiveness might well be the hardest blessing we will

ever offer—or receive. As with any difficult practice, it's important to ask not only for the strength we will need for it, but also the grace: the grace that will, as we practice again and again, begin to shimmer through our wounds, drawing us toward the healing and freedom we could hardly have imagined at the outset.


