A Message from the Pastor


Some of you are old enough to remember the movie *Spartacus* starring Kirk Douglas, Laurence Olivier and Jean Simmons. It was a film about a slave revolt in the Roman Empire. Towards the end of the film, when Spartacus and his band of resisters have been defeated by the superior Roman forces, the Roman general wants to take Spartacus back to Rome but has not been able to identify him. And so he threatens to crucify all of the captured slaves unless they give up Spartacus. Kirk Douglas shouts, "I am Spartacus." Then another slave shouts, "I am Spartacus." And on and on until all the captured slaves have claimed to be Spartacus.

Some years ago, the University of San Francisco had a very effective and engaging advertising campaign in which they showed the picture of different USF students who identified themselves in terms of ethnicity, gender, family history, major, interests and goals. Each student ended by saying, "I am USF." Each was a different part of the whole which was the University of San Francisco community.

Last week, Jesus proclaimed that he was the *Good Shepherd*. This week, Jesus proclaims, "I am the vine, you are the branches." If you remove a branch from the vine, it withers and dies. United with the vine, however, the branch has life coursing through it and can bear much fruit."

This weekend, our second graders will receive the Eucharist for the first time. No longer will they eat at the Children's Table. From now on they dine at the Grown Ups' Table.

God's grace, God's life, God's love will help them grow spiritually. They will experience this grace, this life, this love in four important ways. First, they will experience it by remaining connected to Christ who is present in the faith community. What an awesome responsibility parents have—a responsibility assumed in Baptism—to make sure



that this faith, this spiritual life is both regularly nourished and regularly expressed.
Second, they will experience it by weekly hearing Christ speak to them through the scriptures. Third, they will experience it when they are united with Christ through the reception of the Euchariet

Finally, they will experience it when they encounter Christ who is present in all those in need as well as in all those who serve those in need.



"I am the vine, you are the branches." United with Christ, we can bear much fruit. But cut off from Christ, we can do nothing. And so, Christ urges each and every one of us to "abide in him." As the old hymn Abide with Me proclaims:



Abide with me; fast falls the eventide; the darkness deepens; Lord with me abide. When other helpers fail and comforts flee, help of the helpless, O abide with me.

Come not in terrors, as the King of kings, but kind and good, with healing in Your wings, tears for all woes, a heart for every plea—Come, Friend of sinners, and abide with me.




SESSION 3: CALLED TO JOURNEY IN LOVE

Envelopes to honor our mothers are available in the church and in the parish office, and those names will be displayed in the southeast alcove on Mother's Day and throughout the month of May.






St Ignatius School
