If you blink, you will miss it. If you can't develop a strategy for getting out of the fast lane, the first liturgical season will pass by you by unnoticed. If you can't make the commitment and have the determination to hit "the pause button" for a few minutes during each of the next twenty-two days, you cannot open or experience the grace and gift of Advent. It is as simple and predictable as that.

I recently read a quote by poet Jane Hirshfield that captures for me the dynamic of the Season of Advent. Speaking about poetry, she writes: "Entering a good poem, a person feels, tastes, hears, thinks, and sees in altered ways. Why ask art into a life at all, if not to be transformed and enlarged by its presence and mysterious means?" What Hirshfield says about a good poem can be equally said about entering the Season of Advent. In fact, our problems and difficulties with the Season of Advent are identical to our problems and difficulties with entering a good poem.

John Bell has written a good prayer-poem about Advent. I will be using it over the next four weeks. He will describe Advent as the waiting time, the looking time, the loving time, and the keeping time. Listen to the way the poet invites us into Advent.

*You keep us waiting,
You, the God of all time,
Want us to wait for the right time in which to discover
Who we are, where we must go,
Who will be with us, and what we must do.
So, thank you . . . for the waiting time.*

You will also notice something different in our sanctuary during this season of Advent. Of course, I mean the Advent Wreath. A new candle will be lit each of the four weeks of Advent. That fourth week of Advent will also, coincidentally, be Christmas Eve. So, what can we do to enter more fully into this "waiting season"?

Perhaps using the "Daily Reflections for Advent & Christmas" for five minutes each day will improve and increase our abilities to "wait and watch." Perhaps inviting everyone at the dinner table to share one *blessing* and one *challenge* that they experienced that day would help the entire family improve their *waiting* and *watching* and *listening* skills. Perhaps exercising *patience* with drivers on the road or co-workers or spouses or children or grandchildren or neighbors would be simple but powerful ways to prepare ourselves this *Advent* season.

John Bell's prayer-poem and the season of Advent are all meant "to transform us and enlarge us by their

presence and mysterious means." So, please, be counter-cultural this Advent. Don't simply get caught up in the busyness of preparations for Christmas. Carve out some little piece of time each day to ponder (i.e., reflect deeply upon) the short season we are given as well as the words of John Bell's prayer-poem and the daily reflections from the little book. Together let us be one another's companion (wait together), be one another's vision (look together), be one another's care and compassion (love together), and be one another's spiritual glue (keep together). May all the blessings of Advent be yours this year. . .if you simply let them be just that for you.

FirePit-PDX –TONIGHT....JOIN IN!

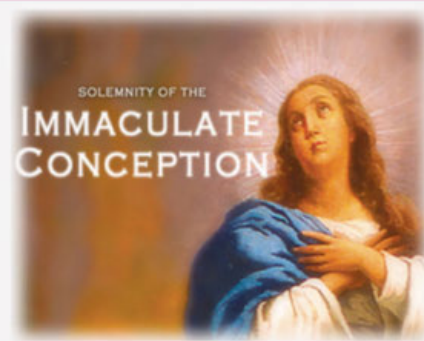

Recently they studied the anatomy of salmon with a salmon dissection with their teacher.

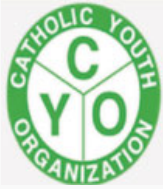

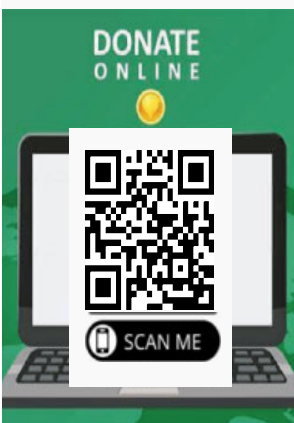
