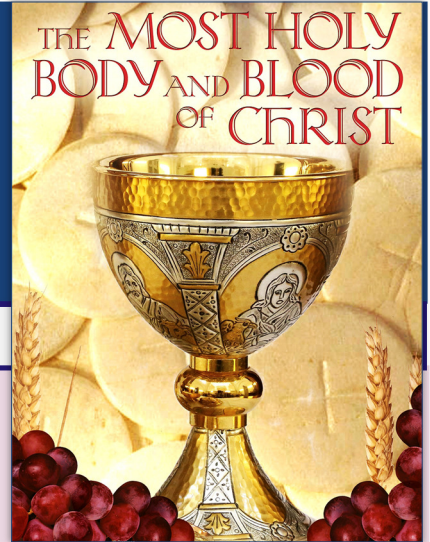
A Message from the Pastor

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This feast originates in the visions of St. Juliana of Mt. Cornillon (1193-1258) and was celebrated first as a local feast but was extended to the whole church by Pope Urban IV in 1264. It was primarily a processional feast, which quickly spread throughout Christendom. The Eucharist was carried throughout a town or village. This reminded people that the risen Christ accompanied them throughout their ordinary lives.

I was blessed, during my years of theological study, with some incredible professors. One of them was John Donohue who is a Jesuit New Testament scholar. He once described an incident that happened to him over 55 years ago when he was traveling from Germany to Israel to study modern Hebrew. During a stopover in Lebanon, he struck up a conversation with a young Muslim student at breakfast. The young Muslim began to question him on the Catholic teaching on Eucharist. Freshly minted from theological studies and armed with the earliest and latest philosophical distinctions, Donohue thought he was responding to the young Muslim's concerns about Catholic belief in real presence. None of his responses seemed to address his deepest concerns, until finally Donohue asked, "What is your most basic problem with what Catholics believe about Eucharist?" The young Muslim thought for a moment and then answered, "Well, if you really believed you were receiving the body and blood of Christ together on Sunday, would you treat each other the way you do?" That is a haunting question for our faith community these days.



As I have watched the news coverage of protests, in the wake of George Floyd's killing, or more recently the beating to death of Tyre Nichols; as I did some remote preparation reflecting on the meaning of this weekend's feast; there were three images that kept surfacing in my imagination. The first image was that of the demonstrations in cities across our Nation proclaiming loudly and clearly that Black Lives Matter.

The second image was of early *Corpus Christi* processions throughout the towns and villages of 13th century Europe. The third was one of the concluding scenes from the film *The Mission*. When the Spanish soldiers enter the mission village, they encounter the singing of Father Gabriel and the Guaraní women and children who march in the procession. Father Gabriel leads them carrying a monstrance with the Blessed Sacrament. After Father Gabriel is shot, a child picks up the Blessed Sacrament and continues to lead the procession.

During the peaceful demonstrations, I can readily imagine the Body of Christ in a monstrance leading these demonstrators. I can imagine that this is exactly where Christ would want to be—with his people, leading them and reminding them that they are now his presence in the world. They are his eyes, his face, his hands, his feet and his compassion in the world. They are to meet and treat each person for what they are—the body of Christ.

In his sermon *The Weight of Glory*, C. S. Lewis wrote: "Next to the Blessed Sacrament itself, your neighbor is the holiest object presented to your senses." Christ's body is as hidden in the least of us as it is under the appearances of bread and wine. Both require an uncommon and daring faith. As the late Cardinal Joseph Bernardin once said:

The Risen Christ is with us this day
And he continues to need each one of us.
Jesus needs our eyes to continue to see.
He needs our strength to continue to work.
He needs our voice to continue to preach.
He needs our hands to continue to bless.
He needs our heart to continue to love.
And Jesus needs our whole being
to continue to build up his body, the Church.
As we believe, so let us live! Amen.
