A Message from the Pastor

I once saw a bumper sticker that read,

"If you were accused of being a Christian, could they find enough evidence to convict you?"


This challenging question points to the conflict created when our words aren't expressed in our actions and our attitudes don't harmonize with our behaviors. It could also be a commentary on our gospel parable of the Two Sons.

Eliza Doolittle laments the disappointment and uselessness of unsupported and unsubstantiated words in the song "Show Me" from the musical *My Fair Lady*.

Words, words, I'm sick of words.

I get words all day through first from him, now from you. Is that all you blighters can do? Don't talk of stars burning above, if you're in love show me.

We have an idiom in English that goes "Actions speak louder than words." The idiom points to this experiential truth—what people do is more important than what they say. People can promise things but then fail to deliver. Another English idiom, we are familiar with, is that "Someone is a Man/Woman of his/her word." This is a person who does what s/he says. That type of person keeps his/her promises.

Are we people of our word? Our actions will confirm a resounding "Yes" or embarrassing "No." St. Paul, in his second letter to the Christian Community at Corinth, reminds them that "For the Son of God, Jesus Christ, whom we preached among you, Silvanus and Timothy and I, was not Yes and No; but in him it is always Yes. For all the promises of God find their Yes in him. That is why we utter Amen through him, to the glory of God." (2 Cor. 1:19-20) The word Amen is often translated as Yes.

St. Ignatius of Loyola, in the concluding contemplation of the Spiritual Exercises entitled "The Contemplation to Love as God Loves," points out this truth: "Love ought to find expression in deeds more than in words." (Sp.Ex. 230) Every weekend, at the conclusion of our liturgy, the priest sends us forth with these words, "Go in peace to love and serve the Lord." It will be our actions in the coming

week that will provide the evidence to convict us of being loving, of being Christian.

Let us pray, in the words of Jesuit theologian Karl Rahner, "Give us the courage and


strength to be worthy of being called Christian." May our faith-in-action be our resounding Amen or Yes to this prayer.




