A Message from the Pastor

This weekend we celebrate Good Shepherd
Sunday. This weekend is an excellent opportunity
to reflect on what it means to be a "servant-leader" or Good Shepherd? This weekend
invites us to focus on one of the key characteristics of a Good Shepherd which is captured by the Latin phrase cura personalis ("care for the person").

A Good Shepherd has a unique relationship with his sheep. He cares for them. He is willing to lay down his life for them. This type of devotion, on the part of the shepherd, builds up trust and love, on the part of the sheep. For the sheep know from experience that when challenges confront them, when danger threatens them, the Good Shepherd will always be there for them. If they ever become confused or lost, the Good Shepherd will look for them, find them, and return them to the comfort and support of the community. The Good Shepherd leads by example. The Good Shepherd loves by serving.

There is a sign over the entrance to Christian Brothers High School in Sacramento that says, "Enter to learn. Leave to serve." This saying represents a sentence summary of both Lasallian and Ignatian spirituality. That would be a great motto for a *Good Shepherds* school. People learn how to love and care for others through the example of their teachers. They then discover, as St. Ignatius articulated in the *Spiritual Exercises*, that love expresses itself in concrete actions—service of our brothers and sisters in need. Jesus the *Good Shepherd* led by example. He epitomized servant-leadership.

The Catholic Church continues to believe that the Eucharist is both the greatest expression of our faith and the greatest source of nurture for our faith. All of you parents (shepherds) who teamed with us in preparing your sons and daughters for First Eucha-

Pastor's Message continued from page one:

Dr. Jason Rogers was a young cardiologist in our sister parish in Sacramento. The Rogers' Family had just returned from Easter vacation and were attending a Sunday morning Mass, as was their custom. When Jason came out of Mass, I cornered him. Dr. Roger's professional expertise was interventional cardiology and vascular medicine. I told him that our senior priest in residence, Fr. Tom Piquado, was experiencing some chest pains. Fr. Tom had had quadruple by-pass surgery about ten years ago.

Jason took his family home and spent Good Shepherd Sunday afternoon at the UC Davis Hospital caring for Fr. Tom, who had experienced a mild heart attack earlier that day. Dr. Rogers and his team wound up putting two stents in

> two blocked veins from Fr. Tom's bypass surgery. From my perspective, Dr. Jason Rogers saved Fr. Tom's life and ministry. Dr. Jason Rogers was a Good Shepherd that day by responding instantly to the need of one of the Jesuits on our pastoral team. Talk about Good Shepherds.

May the Eucharist we share, this weekend, lead us deeper into the mystery of servantleadership, Good Shepherds, cura personalis ("care for the person"), and the new life and peace and hope of Easter. Jesuit poet Gerard Manley Hopkins, in his poem Easter Communion, writes: "Breathe Easter now." Let us help each other do this throughout these fifty days of Easter. And remember the air we breathe is that of Good Shepherds.
