Wisdom from the Pews

I am writing this reflection on April 16, the middle of Holy Week . . .a week when we intensely

focus on the Paschal Mystery. I find so much joy in knowing that the Easter Season lasts for 50 days. 50 days to continue to focus on this mystery and the promise of Jesus of our own Resurrection. I find ways to add to joy to my life throughout the 50 days. I invite you to do the same.

The Scripture readings for this Sunday are so rich in their continuing invitation to reflect on the Paschal Mystery. We continue to live that mystery in the midst of each day of our lives. I share with you part of a poem written by the Sufi mystic, Rumi:


This being is a guest house.
Every morning a new arrival.
A joy, a depression, a meanness,
some momentary awareness comes
as an unexpected visitor. . .
Be grateful for whatever comes
because each has been sent
as a guide from beyond.

In today's Gospel reading Jesus reminds us that we are never alone. Just as the voice of a shepherd is heard by sheep, we are invited to listen to the voice of Jesus, our Shepherd, in the midst of all that unfolds in our lives. As we end each day can we entrust all that has happened with trust and joy to our Loving God?

I was struck in the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles by the variety of events happening in the lives of Paul and Barnabas. They continue on their journey. They enter the synagogue and urge converts to be faithful to the grace of God. Can we at the end of each day recognize God's grace and ask: How have I been faithful?

Then Paul and Barnabas become the object of jealousy and violent abuse, experience persecution, protests against them. The reading ends by saying, "The disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit." In the midst of all, it seems they heard the voice of the Shepherd and drew strength from that. In the midst of the distress and suffering of the time we live in, can we allow the words of Revelation to strengthen our hope in the fulfillment of Jesus' promises to us: "For the Lamb who is in the center of the throne will shepherd them and lead them to springs of life-giving water, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."

What tears can you bring to Jesus and pray "Jesus, help me, heal me?" What "springs of life-giving water" can you become aware of and say "Thank you?"

St Ignatius School We, the community of St. Ignatius School, in the tradition of Mother Marie Rose and St. Ignatius of Loyola, provide a faith-centered Catholic education guiding God's children toward building a just and compassionate world.

Our Kindergarten students lead us in a beautiful Easter season Mass this week with the assistance of some delightful seventh graders. Mr. MacKenzie sang a beautiful Easter song, and our fourth grade class played a







lovely song on their recorders, in addition to all of the talented choir singers and musicians. Our hearts felt full of joy for our Risen Christ as we left Mass.

We recently celebrated the arrival of spring with our annual spring con-

cert. What a delight to surprise our retiring teacher, Mrs. Robinson, with a song to the tune of the familiar Simon & Garfunkel song of the song of the same name.

Our students continued expanding their eager minds this week. The preschoolers have been

busy writing words and collecting data on small clipboards with paper as they 'survey' the room. The kindergartners are practicing writing words. The first grade is studying the butterfly life cycle by observing their newly arrived caterpillars. The second grade students took on bag decoration and assembling for our Transition Lunches this week. In third grade, the students worked on their suspension bridges this week as their study of bridge types continued. The fourth graders learned about how to grow avocados from the seed. And they are creating all natural recipes for household products in stewardship of our planet. Our fifth graders are learning to divide fractions. In sixth grade English Language Arts class, the students are in a novel study of **Walk Two Moons**. The seventh graders and eighth graders took a field trip to La Salle High School to see the Anastasia spring play supporting fellow classmates- Tenley George from 7th grade and Lila MacKenzie from 8th grade- with roles in the production. In the days after the trip, students will discuss the literary elements of the story.

Our diligent, hardworking staff have compiled an enormous data library of evidence and completed <u>self-ratings' worksheets</u> with multiple benchmarks for each of the 13 standards across these four domains. **DOMAINS:**

Mission and Catholic Identity-Standards 1-4

Identified *strength*: Mission statement and Catholic values are embodied within the life of the school.

**Possible area for *growth*: Increasing student retreat opportunities across grade levels.

Governance and Leadership Standards 5-6

Identified *strength*: Strong mission alignment and collaboration among leadership groups- Leadership Advisory Team, Staff Committees, School Advisory Council, Parent Association, Finance Council, and Parish Leadership Team. **Possible area for *growth*: Providing school communications in other languages and through varied methods.

<u>Academic Excellence</u>- Standards 7-9

Identified **strength**: Addition of a full time school psychologist and strong learning support for all students. **Possible area for **growth**: Develop a schoolwide professional development plan incorporating culturally responsive practices aligned to Catholic social teaching.

Operational Vitality- Standards 10-13

Identified *strength*: Budgeting for teacher professional development in alignment with the school's mission. **Possible area for *growth*: An updated Master Plan is needed that will include fully developed and written plans for finance processes, enrollment, facilities, and development. We look forward to sharing more updates with our whole community as we prepare for our accreditation visit next October.

May we marvel in the joy of the Easter season. "Let the heavens be glad and the earth rejoice; let the sea and what fills it resound; let the plains be joyful and all that is in them. Then let all the trees of the forest rejoice." Psalm 96, 11:12.






