A Message from the Pastor

In the movie Wonder, August Pullman's Fifth
Grade English teacher introduces his class to maxims. A maxim is a principle or rule of conduct. The first maxim that Mr. Browne gives his class is this: "When given the choice between being right and being kind—choose kind."

In another film—The Shape of Water—kindness becomes the language of communication between a mute cleaning lady and a mysterious fishman. She can't speak. He doesn't speak a language the audience understands. But a bond is established and trust grows because of the kindness and compassion of Elisa for this fishman who was captured in the waters of South America. I know this sounds like a strange film. It is. But the film is simply beautiful and captures what St. Paul proclaimed to the community at Corinth—the incredible power of love.

Both of these films deal with a demon that possesses us and afflicts us today. That demon is fear—especially, fear of the stranger, fear of the person who is not like us, fear of the person who doesn't look like us or think like us or feel like us or act like us or vote like us.

In Mark's gospel, the first official act of Jesus' public ministry is to confront the unclean spirit that possesses the man in the synagogue. Jesus' words to this poor man are equally spoken to those of us possessed by the demons of fear or addiction—"Quiet! Come out of him!"

The Jesuit paleontologist, Pierre Teilhard de Chardin, once wrote: "Someday, after mastering the winds, the waves, the tides and gravity, we shall harness for God the energies of love, and then, for the second time in the history of the world, man will have discovered fire."

The second expression of love, in St. Paul's great hymn to love in his First Letter to the Corinthians, is kindness. "Love is patient. Love is kind." Kindness can quiet the demons that afflict us. Kindness can drive those unclean spirits out of us. But kindness can only be discovered and practiced at a price. Naomi Shihab Nye reminds us of this in her poem Kindness.

Before you know what kindness really is you must lose things, feel the future dissolve in a moment like salt in a weakened broth.

Before you know kindness as the deepest thing inside, you must know sorrow as the other deepest thing. You must wake up with sorrow. You must speak to it till your voice catches the thread of all sorrows and you see the size of the cloth.





Then it is only kindness that makes sense anymore, only kindness that ties your shoes and sends you out into the day to mail letters and purchase bread, only kindness that raises its head from the crowd of the world to say it is I you have been looking for, and then goes with you every where like a shadow or a friend.



Action Alert

The Office of Justice and Ecology shared this action alert on the asylum restrictions proposed in the Supplementary Funding Package.

Here's an excerpt: "...Our Catholic faith calls us to welcome the stranger, to feed the hungry and to clothe the naked. Congress and the Biden Administration are currently considering changes to immigration policy that would place devastating barriers between migrants in danger and a chance at safety in the United States. We oppose these dangerous proposals that would, among other things, make it much more difficult to claim asylum and severely limit the number of people that can access asylum in a given year..." 
