A Message from the Pastor

Easter brings us many gifts. By listening to



our scriptural stories, during the Easter season, we deepen our awareness of those precious gifts that we need and Easter brings. Easter brings us new life. In the northern hemisphere, we are surrounded by signs of nature renewing itself. The spirit of Jesus, risen from the dead, renews life in us and all around us. We even pray, as Catholics, "Send forth your Spirit and renew the face of the earth." We remember this and celebrate it every Easter.

Easter brings us forgiveness. Christ's birth, Christ's life (his preaching, teaching and healing), Christ's suffering and death on the cross accomplished our redemption. Easter reminds us that sin could not hold us captive and death did not have the last word. Just as we have been forgiven and redeemed, so are we to be agents of forgiveness and redemption in our communities and our world.

Easter brings us joy and hope and mission. In Matthew's resurrection accounts, the Easter proclamation by the angels is "Do not be afraid." This brings joy and hope to the women who have come to Jesus' tomb. The angel sends them to proclaim this good news—*Resurrexit sicut dixit. He has risen as he said.*—to the disciples in Jerusalem. In Luke's gospel the angel asks the women who first come to the tomb, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen." When the women returned to the city, their news fills the disciples with joy and hope.



Easter brings us peace. In many of Christ's resurrection appearances, his first words are, "Peace be with you." Christ's risen presence and Easter message brings peace to all who hear this and are able to allow that message, that peace, to fill their hearts and minds.

Ronald Rolheiser once wrote something about the relationship of forgiveness and peace. "This is a mature insight: It's not a crime or a sin to be incompatible, it's only unfortunate. We spend too much time and energy angry and frustrated with each other over something that basically we cannot control or change. Our differences, however much they may frustrate us and tax our patience at times, are not a crime, a sin, or indeed even any-one's fault. We don't need to blame someone, be angry at someone, or resent someone because he or she is different than we are, no matter how much those differences separate us, frustrate us, and try our patience and understanding."

At many AA meetings, the participants pray the short version of the *Serenity Prayer*. Attributed to Reinhold Niebuhr, the full text is an excellent Easter Peace Prayer. During these fifty days of Easter, may we pray it often for ourselves and one another.



God grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change; the courage to change the things I can; and the wisdom to know the difference. Living one day at a time; enjoying one moment at a time; accepting hardships as the pathway to peace; taking, as He did, this sinful world as it is, not as I would have it; trusting that He will make all things right if I surrender to His Will; that I may be reasonably happy in this life and supremely happy with Him forever in the next. Amen.


