

A Message from the Pastor



The theater principle is that characters reveal who they are by what they say and what they do on stage. Characters and human beings can equivocate with their words. It is difficult, if not impossible, to sustain physical lies.

My father used to regularly repeat a maxim to me, when I was a young boy: "Talk is cheap. Whiskey costs money!" In terms of our scripture readings for this Sunday, it is one thing to say we love God and our neighbor but it is something altogether different to act in a loving way to the God who is somehow mysteriously present in the person of our neighbor—especially, our neighbors in need.

In Jesus' time, religiously observant Jews would pray a special prayer (i.e. the *Schema Israel*) twice a day—once at sunrise and once at sunset. "Hear O Israel, the Lord our God, the Lord is One. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your might."



The Pharisee in our gospel story only asks for one commandment—the greatest. Jesus gives him a twofer reply. He quotes the Schema Israel and then adds that "the second is like the first: you shall love your neighbor as yourself." The way we show our love for God is in the ways that we treat and respond to our neighbors—those neighbors we know, as well as those we don't know; those neighbors we like and find it easy to love, as well as those neighbors who make concrete acts of love an incredible challenge.

In the first letter of St. John, we read about words and acts of love. "Those who say, 'I love God,' and hate their brothers and sisters, are liars; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen." (I Jn. 4:20)



This weekend, we hear again the *Love Command* that Jesus gives us. The way to love God is by loving the neighbor before us, next to us, in front of us, behind us. This is the meaning of the foot-washing in John's gospel. This is the significance of the words that the priest says after the words of Institution, "Do this in remembrance of me." We love others concretely because we have been first loved concretely by our compassionate God.



May our patron saint, St. Ignatius of Loyola, inspire us to love not simply in words but in deeds. May our witness invite and inspire others to love not just in words but in simple and concrete acts of love.

All Saints and All Souls -Holy Day Masses


TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 1 AND WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 2

Tibbetts House Refugees Start School in Portland!

The Jamba family arrived from Tanzania in May. They stayed at Tibbetts House for six weeks before moving into permanent housing secured by Catholic Charities (CC). Because CC faces staffing shortages, they were

unable to help navigate school enrollment for the family's children. As St. Ignatius volunteers, we used PPS School Finder to identify the family's local school and accompanied the family to the school office for enrollment. PPS was incredibly helpful and linked the family with ESL, bus, and meal program services. They also directed us to the local Head Start program for the younger child's preschool, conveniently located right next door to the elementary school. With the help of a donated bike from a volunteer, the family can easily transport their little one to preschool daily.
