
A Message from the Pastor

As many of you know, I had the wonderful opportunity of spending three and a half years in Florence, Italy. I was Dean of the Gonzaga-in-Florence program. During that time, one of my



great joys was visiting the churches, basilicas and cathedrals of Italy. While visiting these remarkable sacred spaces, I noticed something different than our American churches.

You could not find a baptismal font in the older churches of Florence. Baptisms took place in the Cathedral Baptistry and only there. Over the baptismal font you would always find a fresco of today's parable of the Last Judgment from Matthew's gospel. This was the faith that children and adults were brought into. The painted parable of the baptistery ceiling gave the new Christian the final exam questions they would have to answer when they met the Lord after death. Those questions were simple and concrete. Did you feed the hungry? Did you give drink to the thirsty? Did you clothe the naked? Did you visit the sick and imprisoned? Did you welcome the stranger? Did you bury the dead?

Please note that both those whose lives exemplify this spirit of service and those whose lives are missing this spirit of service are surprised. "When did we see you hungry or thirsty or naked or sick or in prison or a stranger?" But there are two types of shock. First, the shock of those whose lives reflect these corporal (i.e. bodily) works of mercy. When they were offering food or drink or comfort or welcome or community, they were meeting and offering these gifts to the Christ who is found in the least of our brothers and sisters. Second, the shock of those whose lives are empty of such corporal works of mercy. What they withheld from the needy, they really withheld from the Christ who came to them clothed in need.


Pastor's Message continued from page one:

As a Jesuit parish, we hope everything we do on the weekends or during the week has an Ignatian flavor. We hope that through our efforts as "companions in mission" we can become men and women for other. We hope that we can learn how to care for the whole person (*cura personalis*). We hope that the scriptures we hear and the Eucharist we share will help us make good choices in our homes, in our parish, and in our civic community (*discernment*). We hope that our faith finds expression in our efforts to promote justice in every aspect of our Church, our community and our world. We hope that, like St. Ignatius, we can always strive for excellence (the *magis*). We hope that we can find God in all people and all things.

The poet T. S. Eliot reminds us:

What we call the beginning is often the end And to make an end is to make a beginning. The end is where we start from. . .





As we conclude this liturgical year, and embark on a new one next weekend, let us help one another, when our vision grows dim, to find and serve the Christ who comes to us poor, hungry, naked, sick or in prison, a stranger—as the least of our brothers and sisters—for this is what we have been called to do through our baptism.

cis urged the world to take "only one side" in the Israeli-Palestinian war – the one "of peace." He added, "War does not solve


