A Message from the Pastor

On the Third Sunday of Lent, I shared some lines from Mary Oliver's poem *Sometimes*. Those lines bear repeating on this Easter Sunday.

> Instructions for living a life. Pay attention. Be astonished. Tell about it.

Easter celebrates the triumph of Life over Death. Easter reminds us that Love is stronger than death. Easter invites us to "Pay Attention" to the signs of new life all around us. You can see some of those signs outside the church as well as inside the church.

Outside the church building we see branches putting forth new buds, flowers blooming, birds chirping and nesting, the light of day lengthening—all signs of new life. Inside the church we see the sanctuary simply but beautifully decorated, the liturgical color change from Lenten purple to Easter white, and we hear the glorious return of our "Alleluia" which was buried the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday.

But if we don't pay careful attention, we may miss other important signs of new life. Have visited one of the new additional restrooms in the vestibule of



our church? Have you taken a good look at the illuminated stained-glass representation of the baptism of Jesus? Have you participated in or followed with interest our efforts to become a more "listening Church"? Are you aware of the work of your fellow parishioners who help with the St. Vincent de Paul Society, the Tibbetts House Ministry, our Just Faith course offerings? Continued >>>

Have you heard the difference that our new grand piano has made to our Sunday worship music? Have you made a financial commitment to help us realize our hope for a new heating and cooling system in our church?

These are some of the new signs of life around our St. Ignatius of Loyola church. They are the result of the generosity and love of members of our parish who are grateful for our past and hopeful in our future. All these signs can give us one more opportunity to remember and give thanks. And perhaps shout an alleluia or two.

The egg with the young chick springing from its shell is one of the earliest symbols of Easter for Christians. It is a reminder of Christ who rose from the dead and emerged from the tomb. For the next fifty days we will be hearing stories about the resurrected Jesus appearing to his disciples. A common theme that runs through these Easter stories is that the disciples didn't recognize the resurrected Jesus. Something had changed. All the more reason, during



this Easter season, to take Mary Oliver's wise advice:



Pay attention. Be astonished. Tell about it.


