## A Message from the Pastor

This weekend we experience the second great story about coming to faith in Jesus. It is the story of the Man Born Blind (Jn. 9:1-41). As this young man gradually comes to experience and be-


lieve in Jesus--first, as a man; second, as a prophet; and third, as the Son of God--this young man will gradually move from blindness to sight, from darkness into light. Like all good healing, this will happen over time.

On this 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent, our Elect will experience the second scrutiny as part of their final preparation to be fully incorporated into our faith community. This second scrutiny can be the occasion of a deepening and renewal of healing for the entire faith community. Together with the Elect we will pray:

Free these Elect from the false values that surround and blind them. Set them firmly in your truth, children of the light forever.

As St. Paul reminds the Christian community at Ephesus and at St. Ignatius Loyola Parish in Portland, "You were once in darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Live as children of the light, for light produces every kind of goodness and righteousness and truth."

This year, those that gather virtually or in person for IGNITE have been exploring *discernment*. Practically speaking, they are learning how to make important choices in life that ensure that they will continue to "walk in the light." The Spirit of God will



light." The Spirit of God will always invite us into the light. The spirit which is the enemy of our human nature will tempt us to remain in the darkness through selfishness, through fear, through resentment and anger, through a variety of destructive attitudes and behaviors. But only "walking in the light," through the invitation and assistance of God's Spirit, can bring us peace—even in the face of sacrifice or suffering.

### Pastor's Message continued from page one:

As the Gospel hymn reminds us:

Walk in the light, beautiful light, come where the dewdrops of mercy shine bright. Shine all around us by day and by night, Jesus is the light of the world.

When we regard the needs of others more important than our own selfish desires—we walk in the light. When enemies begin to speak to one another—we walk in the light. When vengeance gives way to mercy—we walk in the light. When we (1) pay attention, (2) are grateful, and (3) serve others, whether they be needy parents and grandparents, needy spouses, needy children or grand-children, or those most in need around us—we walk in the light.



When we are tempted to live and act out of fear but choose the path of courage—we walk in the light. When we are tempted to be discouraged or despair but choose to hope in the slow work of God in us and around us—we walk in the light.

So with the Elect, on this 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent, we pray:

you are the true light that enlightens the world.
Stir up the desire for good in these Elect (and in us).
Let them rejoice in your light, that they may see,
and, like the man born blind whose sight you restored,
let them prove to be staunch and fearless witnesses to the faith,


As we continue our journey through Lent, may we find light in the darkness "For you, LORD, give light to my lamp; my God brightens my darkness," Psalm 18:29.
