

A Message from the Pastor

According to anthropologist Victor Turner, there are three aspects of ritual transformation:



separation, transition, and reincorporation. Lent is not only a liturgical season for Christians, it is a ritual experience that can change us for the better. Ash Wednesday the color of the season changes from the green of Ordinary Time to the purple of Lent. Ash Wednesday we mark ourselves ritually with ashes. We proclaim to all those who see those ashes on our forehead that we are beginning a 40 day journey to Holy Week and Easter. During this journey we will engage in three specific practices—praying, fasting, and almsgiving. The season and these practices will be the catalysts of conversion or change for us.

Forty is an important number in the Bible and in conversion. The Israelites wandered in the desert for forty years before Joshua led them into the Promised Land. Those forty years changed them. Noah, his family, and the animals they gathered, lived in the Ark for forty days and forty nights before the flood subsided. Those forty days and nights in the Ark changed them. After Jesus was baptized in the Jordan, the Spirit drove him into the desert where he was tested for forty days. That baptism and those forty days in the desert changed him.

In the older translation of the First Lenten Preface for our Eucharistic Prayer, we would pray: "Each year you give us this joyful season when we prepare to celebrate the paschal mystery with mind and heart renewed." Lent is supposed to

change us bit by bit. Each week during Lent we will pray for the Elect who will be fully incorporated into our Faith Community during the Easter Vigil. Our prayer support of them these next six weeks will help change them. Their full communion with us in Word and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil will change all of us. . . .for the better.

What might our Lenten observance—our praying, our fasting, and our almsgiving—accomplish in us? Poet David Whyte gives us a very clear idea in his poem *the Opening of Eyes*.

That day I saw beneath dark clouds the passing light over the water and heard the voice of the world speak out, I knew then, as I had before life is no passing memory of what has been nor the remaining pages in a great book waiting to be read.

It is the opening of eyes long closed. It is the vision of far off things seen for the silence they hold. It is the heart after years of secret conversing speaking out loud in the clear air.

It is Moses in the desert fallen to his knees before the lit bush. It is the man throwing away his shoes



as if to enter heaven and finding himself astonished, opened at last, fallen in love with solid ground.



Through our Lenten observance—the imaginative ways that we pray, fast and give alms—may the Lord, who calls us into this transforming season, bring about "the opening of eyes long shut" to his presence and his love. Remember—we journey together. Remember this journey will change us for the better, if we let it.




