

#### Wisdom from the Pews

The focus of this week's gospel is the Apostle Thomas... Or is it?



Oddly, as politics and technological "advances" provoke *uncertainty* about the world and its future, people seem increasingly *certain* about what they think is good, right, and true. I have taught Theology in Jesuit high schools for a decade. Educating is my vocation. But I make no bones about it: faith education is no easy task in this age. One of the challenges is contending with a bent toward *my truth* over the pursuit of *the Truth*. Another is the rise of artificial intelligence, powerful machines that can create the illusion of absolute knowledge despite deeper questions remaining unexplored. These phenomena are not challenges unique to adolescents or in Catholic, Jesuit schools; we are all swimming in certainty in uncertain times.

The weeks and months following Jesus' death must have deeply affected the Twelve, turning their world upside down. When the disciples declare, "We have seen the Lord," Thomas demands cold, hard evidence over hope-filled stories: "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nail marks and my hand into his side, I will not believe." When I pray about this passage, I see myself in Thomas, particularly when I have thought, felt, or acted under the assumption that *someone must be wrong for me to be right*. Like everyone, I impulsively seek comfort in "knowing" and become uneasy when I sense what I thought was right might actually be wrong. As a result, anxiety builds and sometimes sends me spiraling.

What do the disciples have that Thomas lacks? Most exclaim "proof!", which is not wrong. But when I look harder at the passage, my focus shifts from Thomas to Jesus. The first time Christ enters the room where his disciples hide, He says, "Peace be with you... showed them his hands and his side" and "the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord." For good measure, Jesus says, "Peace be with you," to the disciples a



second time before imparting the gifts of the Holy Spirit upon them. Fast forward a week later and again it is not until Jesus says, "Peace be with you," and instructs Thomas to "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe," that he exclaims, "My Lord and my God!"

## Wisdom from the Pews continued from page one:

I believe the wisdom in this week's gospel is not found by plunging our finger into Christ's side. Rather wisdom lies in treating Jesus' greeting-"Peace be with you"—as an invitation to let go of our inclination for certainty and reflect on our tolerance for the *mystery* of our faith, to ask whether we grant ourselves the inner freedom to believe without seeing in the everyday.






We are currently accepting applications for kindergarten

### SOUNDS FROM THE GROUNDS

On **Sunday May 4**<sup>th.</sup> the Eco-Team will be hosting a plant sale in honor of Mother's Day. Time to be determined, but it will coordinate with the morning mass times.

The **new candle holders** in the windowsill are made from the salvaged wood from the former Maple tree that once stood tall where the turf now resides by the school.

The **new planter boxes** will be constructed from Juniper, a wood sourced from grassland and watershed restoration projects in Central-Eastern Oregon, primarily in the John Day, Blue Basin area. Juniper is rugged and enduring, like the land it comes from. Cheaper and more durable than cedar Juniper is a great exterior wood for eco-conscience choices. The wood was procured from Sustainable Northwest Woods located in SE Portland. Fun fact they provided all of the wood used for the finished ceilings at the recent PDX International Airport remodel.




