A Message from the Pastor

Dora Bittau's fifth and final panel, from the life of St. Ignatius, is entitled *Abid-ing Intimacy with the Trinity in Rome*. A lot is going on in this final panel. St. Ignatius is seated in his rooms in Rome—rooms which were restored some twenty-five years ago by California Jesuit Tom Lucas, SJ. Ignatius is pictured as the Administrator. During his final years he wrote the *Constitutions* of the Society of Jesus which have guided it to this very day. He dictated his *Autobiography* (reluctantly) and referred to himself as *the Pilgrim* in it. He composed over 6,800 letters as a way of both governing the Society of Jesus from a distance and offering spiritual advice to the many people who sought it from him. And he continued to refine *The Spiritual Exercises*.


Fr. Jerry Cobb, SJ, from Seattle University, knows the artist and her panels better than anyone else that I have met. In an e-mail to me, this is what Fr. Jerry Cobb has to say about this fifth panel. "This is a richly detailed painting that summarizes or captures the graces of Ignatius as the first General of the Society of Jesus. As an 'administrator' he now picks up the pen to write spiritual and administrative letters to

his companions—symbolized by the two Jesuits who are about to step through the open blue doorway into the worldwide mission of the Society. Above that doorway is the seal of the Socity of Jesus, sun spokes radiating like a compass to all corners of the world into which they are sent, with IHS as the identity of Jesus centering their vision. Ignatius is surrounded by books again, as he was in Paris, but this time we might take them to be both the spiritual classics that shaped him as well as administrative books and the books of his own spiritual journals and letters."

I don't think Ignatius had any idea that his prayer "place me with your Son" would be answered by God asking him to be an administrator or dictating his *Autobiography* or composing the *Constitutions*, but these were the concrete expressions of love and what it meant for Ignatius, in his final years, to be a *companion of Jesus*. All of this was foretold in the twenty-first chapter of John's gospel when Jesus told Peter, "When you were younger, you used to fasten your own belt and go wherever you wished.

But when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will fasten a belt around you and take you where you do not wish to go." This is what "love in action" means.

How many of you parents or grandparents ever envisioned being a Not-For-Profit Babysitting Sitting Service for your grandchildren? How many of you married couples ever imagined that the living out of your wedding vows would entail accompanying and caring for your spouse as he or she suffered gradual diminishment and death because of ill-ness? How many of you who have children or grandchildren with addictions ever thought you would be called upon to practice "tough love" on them? How many of you who are rapidly aging or homebound ever thought that you would be challenged in your weakness to "trust" and "hope" in the God who can be found in all things—including our aging process?

In a prayer attributed to Fr. Pedro Arrupe, SJ, the 28th General of the Society of Jesus, we read:

Nothing is more practical than finding God, than falling in Love in a quite absolute, final way. What you are in love with, what seizes your imagination, will affect everything. It will decide what will get you out of bed in the morning, what you do with your evenings, how you spend your weekends, what you read, whom you know, what breaks your heart, and what amazes you with joy and gratitude. Fall in Love, stay in love, and it will decide everything.



As we celebrate the feast of St. Ignatius Loyola, may this be true for all of us who make his desire our desire and his prayer our prayer— "Place me with your Son."

Barbara Suzanne Sharkey, Barbara Suzanne Sharkey, cousin of a longtime St. Ignatius family was born in 1936. She died on May 18, 2023 and her Mass of Christian Burial was held at St. Ignatius Parish. She was raised in southeast Portland, attended St. Stephen's grade school, St. Mary's Academy, and the University of Portland. She treasured her Catholic education. After her college graduation she committed herself to a life of public service as a social worker in California. It was her way of living out her Catholic faith as she helped families attain housing, providing them with security and hope for their futures.

Sue returned to the Portland area in 2018 to be close to her family. At that time she began attending St. Ignatius parish for weekly Mass. But after 2020, due to Covid and her declining health, she was unable to attend Mass in person. She always appreciated having the Eucharist brought to her at her memory care facility. Sue's Catholic faith was always at the heart of who she was.

Even though Sue was able to attend Mass in person at St. Ignatius for just

over a year, she was moved to donate a significant amount from her estate to our parish. We are profoundly grateful for Sue's generosity and for the gift she was to our community.
