
The goal of the Pastoral Council is to enhance the quality of parish life. We aid the pastor in identifying the pastoral needs of the community, develop a plan for

### A Message from the Pastor

The *Spiritual Exercises* of St. Ignatius of Loyola are divided into four weeks. Don't think of these weeks as calendar weeks as much as



"themes." The First Week focuses on creation, fall and redemption. The Second Week starts with the Incarnation and follows the life of Christ right up to his final days in Jerusalem. The Third Week invites us into the passion and death of Jesus. The Fourth Week invites us into the hope and joy of the Resurrection.

Each week has a special grace or gift for those who enter into it. Holy Week, which commences on Palm/Passion Sunday, ushers us into the final days of Jesus Christ on earth. In terms of the *Spiritual Exercises*, Holy Week invites us into the Third Week. The grace that St. Ignatius encourages us to pray for is this—"sorrow with Christ in sorrow; a broken spirit with Christ so broken; tears; and interior suffering because of the great suffering which Christ endured for me." (*Sp. Ex. 203*)

On Palm Sunday, we will experience the events of Christ's passion from the Gospel of Mark. Two major themes run through Mark's entire passion story. The *first theme* focuses on Jesus who with intense determination gives his life for others. The *second theme* focuses on those who surround Jesus—some withering in the crucible of suffering, some exemplifying faith and courage.

On Holy Thursday, we will join the Elect in *remembering and giving thanks*. We will recall the words and actions of that last meal that Jesus shared with



friends. We will remember the meaning of Eucharist service! We will recall Christ's haunting words, "Do you know what I have done for you? I have given you an example. What I have done for you, you must do for one another. Now that you know these things, happy will you be when you put them into practice." (Jn. 13:12-17)

### Pastor's Message continued from page one:

On Good Friday, we will join the Elect in recalling the great act of love in Jesus' suffering and death on the cross. We will watch as love in nailed to a cross. We will witness the extent of God's love for us in Jesus Christ. We may understand for the first time what St. John Chrysostom wrote about the cross.




Thanks to the Cross, we no longer wander in the desert, for we have found the right way; we are no longer outside the palace, for we have found the entrance; we no longer fear the flaming arrows of the devil, for we have seen where the font of water is. Thanks to the Cross there is no longer widowhood, for we have the Groom; we no longer fear wolves, for we have the Good Shepherd. Thanks to the Cross we no longer fear the tyrant, for we are by the side of the King.



As the events of this most Holy Week unfold, let us stand with the Elect. Let us pray for them and ourselves that as we witness the length and breadth and height and depth of God's love for us in Jesus Christ, that the events of Holy Week can transform us into Christ's eyes and feet and heart and hands in the world today.


