A Message from the Pastor


Mary Oliver, in her poem Sometimes, shares this wisdom:

Tell about it.





lives.










Pastor's Message continued from page one:

Care of Creation Team Climate change is a global issue. "Many of the poor live in areas particularly affected by phenomena related to (global) warming, and their means of subsistence are largely dependent of natural reserves and ecosystemic services such as agriculture, fishing and forestry.

They have no other financial activities or resources which can enable them to adapt to climate change or to face natural disasters, and their access to social services and protection is very limited. "Sadly, there is wide-spread indifference to such suffering, which is even now taking place throughout our world. Our lack of re-

sponse to these tragedies involving our brothers and sisters points to the loss of the sense of responsibility for our fellow man and women which all civil society is founded." This leads to migration of people affected by this issues. How can we help both personally and collectively address this issue? Ponder this as we move into Lent. 




