

A Message from the Pastor

Elect we will hear the third great story about people coming to faith in the Gospel of John. It is the story of The Raising of Lazarus (Jn. 11:1-45). There are five important characters in this story—Martha, Mary, Lazarus, Jesus, and the witnesses. This story invites us to reflect on many faith questions. We can begin by asking ourselves three basic questions. First, with what character in this story do I identify most? Second, with what charac-

ter in this story do I identify with least? Third, what do each of these characters represent in me?



And yet Jesus calls Martha to deeper faith when he tells her, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" That is the question that today's gospel ("good news") addresses to us and to our Elect. "Do you believe this?" Do you believe that all things work together unto



good for those who love God? Do you believe that God calls us, even in the most difficult and challenging circumstances, to choose life the blessing? Do you believe that God's love is stronger than death? Do you believe that for those who love God life is changed not ended? Do you believe?

## Pastor's Message continued from page one:

Lazarus is in the tomb and bound. What are the places of death we have dwelt in during periods of our life? While we would not choose to live in tombs, some of our life choices can feel like they lead us into places of death rather than places where life is flourishing. What are the things that bind us? What are the things that prevent us from responding to Christ's invitation to life in abundance? While Jesus calls Lazarus out of the tomb, Lazarus has the ability to accept or reject that invitation. Have there been times when I have rejected Christ's invitation to "life in abundance" because of fear or other things that bind me? What do I need, at this time in my life, in order to respond to Jesus' invitation and command, "Lazarus, come forth."?



On this Fifth Sunday of Lent, let pray for our Elect and ourselves:

Lord Jesus,


by raising Lazarus from the dead you showed that you came that we might have life and have it more abundantly.

Free from the grasp of death those who await your life-giving sacraments and deliver them from the spirit of corruption.

Through you Spirit, who gives life, fill them with faith, hope, and charity, that they may live with you always in the glory of the resurrection, for you are Lord forever and ever. Amen.




