Pastor's Message

The Baptism of Jesus

Dear Parishioners:

Today's feast of the Baptism of the Lord brings the Christmas season to an end. When Jesus emerges from the waters of the river Jordan, he fulfills the promise to Israel – that a messiah would bring peace by championing justice. When we baptize our babies today, they receive the same mission – to be bearers of peace and justice to a broken world.

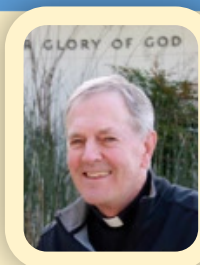
What is our mission? In the 2019 Christmas address to the clergy in Vatican City, Pope Francis explained that he sees his mission as "the ongoing reform of the Roman curia." The pope said that today very few countries can be described as "Christian," and that new ways of evangelizing are necessary.

What is the main obstacle of new ways of drawing people to Christ? Rigidity. Pope Francis said that rigidity in church leaders comes from fear of change – "erecting fences and obstacles on the terrain of the common good, turning it into a minefield of incomprehension and hatred."

Pope Francis quoted Cardinal Newman, whom he canonized in October: "To live is to change, and to be perfect is to have changed often." For Newman, change was conversion, that is, an interior transformation. Such conversion shows that Christian life is a pilgrimage, a process of moving closer to God.

Conversion and transformation are part of an individual's response to God's call, but also must take place within the Curia, which is called to be at the service of the People of God in their mission to witness to the gospel.

"Obviously," the pope said, "it's not about seeking change for change's sake or about following fashions, but of having the conviction that development and growth are characteristic of earthly and human life, while from a believer's perspective, at the center of everything there is the stability of God."

The Curia reform project begins with fidelity to the deposit of faith and tradition. The reform values what good has been done, and values preserving its roots so that it can be fruitful. "But invoking memory does not mean grasping onto self-preservation – it means recalling a process in continual development." The Pope quoted the 19th-century composer Gustav Mahler, "Tradition is not the worship of ashes, but the preservation of fire."

The Curia used to distinguish two fairly well-defined shores: a Christian world on one side, and a world still to be evangelized on the other. That situation no longer exists. Christianity that produces culture -- or that the human family first or most listens to -- is now seen as a worldview that "is often denied, derided, marginalized or ridiculed."

The mission of the church is to re-gain our credibility by promoting the integral development of the human person in light of the gospel. How? By serving the weakest and most marginalized, particularly forced migrants, who represent at this time a cry in the desert of our humanity.

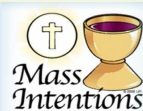
The church "is called to testify that for God, no one is a 'stranger' or 'excluded.' It is called to awaken consciences numbed by indifference to the reality of the Mediterranean Sea, which has become for many a cemetery."

Pope Francis told his top aides that "Christmas is the feast of God's love for us, the divine love that inspires, guides and corrects change, and overcomes the human fear of leaving behind 'security' in order once more to embrace the 'mystery.'"

As the Christmas season concludes with the baptism of Jesus, it is good for us to ponder our mission. What baptism means for you and me is precisely what it meant for Jesus. His baptism was his call and inauguration, his rite of entrance into that mission. In the waters of the Jordan he was initiated and called and commissioned. In today's world, when some of our church leaders resist the Pope's reforms, it is more important than ever for believers who trust the Spirit's initiatives to live with confidence and joy.

As you dip your hand into the miniature baptismal pools (called holy water fonts) when you enter or leave church, think of your dignity, your call, and God's words of your on-going commission: "You are my Beloved in whom I am well pleased. Go, be my disciple."

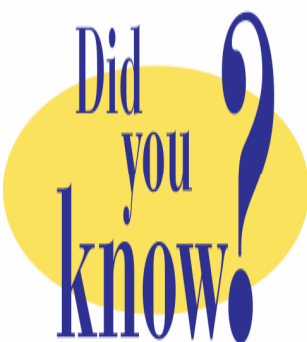

Caring for families is a core value of our parish. Did you know that it's also part of our educational mission to have a quality, affordable, faith-based option for early childhood education for our community?

Right across the parking lot, a program for our 3-5-year-olds was re-imagined last summer. With an expanded space, a redesigned program and a dynamic new director, Matt Crittenden, Eulalie's Garden, Child Development Center at St. Ignatius School, has a 1:9 staffing ratio. We will fully expand next fall and are currently accepting applications for 36 spots. Parishioners have priority admission.

Originally started in 2012 with a generous grant from long-time parishioners Ted and Fran Van Veen, the program was 5 years-old when a landmark study on the value of preschool concluded that a center-based education gave children a strong start to their school years. "We're so grateful to be part of a community-based preschool that is all about helping my son prepare for elementary school while allowing him to be his best 5-year-old self. They are true partners in his development and, as a parent, I can't ask for more," commented Simmi Singh Corcoran, parent.

Students who attend Eulalie's Garden, CDC, do not need to re-apply for admission to the kindergarten program. Please join us for Open House or call for a tour.

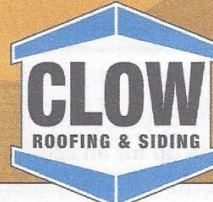

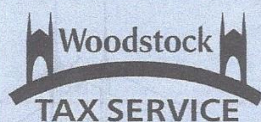
