Keep On Keeping On

Dear Parishioners:

This weekend is the 30th anniversary of the martyrdom of six Jesuits and their housekeepers, Elba and Celina Ramos in El Salvador in the early morning of November 16 1989. During the Salvadoran civil war, the Jesuits were advocates for a negotiated settlement between the government and the rebels. The murders attracted international attention to the ten-year-old civil war, and precipitated eventual peace. The politicians who planned the killings and the soldiers who carried them out were brought to justice in May 2011.

As the church concludes the liturgical year, the readings are about the end of the world. While you may not believe that the end of the world is near, neither do you and I know the day nor the hour when the end will come for each of us. Our prayer is to live our lives as well as we can so that when our last day comes, we are ready.

The Old Testament reading from Malachi pictures the day of reckoning as destruction for evildoers and vindication for the holy ones.

On the journey to Jerusalem in Luke, Jesus has been teaching his disciples about the requirements for following him. Now in Jerusalem, as he gazes upon the beauty of the Temple, he gives a final exhortation.

As God's prophet, Jesus warns against false prophets who pretend to know the details of God's plan, gives hints about the events that will accompany the coming of God's kingdom, and warns about impending persecutions and even divisions within families.

Jesus promises trying times but ends with this encouragement: "By your perseverance you will secure your lives." This perseverance is not an invitation to apathy or timidity much less laziness. The biblical concept of perseverance is active resistance in the face of opposition. What inspires this kind of active resistance to evil is hope – trust in God's promises.

Hope and perseverance are two sides of the same coin. Hope without perseverance is anxiety and ends in madness. Perseverance without hope leads to resignation, fatalism and bland indifference.

Regarding the end of the world, Christians hope for the full coming of God's kingdom. This means resurrection of the dead, a final judgment where everyone's motives and intentions are revealed, and entry into complete communion with God. Christians expect these events to come about in God's time and way.

In the meantime, what characterizes Christian life is patient perseverance. This is the biblical disposition of living gratefully in the present. At each Mass in the preparation of the gifts, we place the tensions and dreams of our broken world on the plate and in the cup. We offer our lives to God in the bread and the wine. And in the transformation of the gifts into the presence of Christ, God gradually animates us and our world into a new creation.

Jesus' final teaching on discipleship is how to respond to hatred and enmity. First, trust that you will know how to respond to your accusers. Second, you can withstand your trials with an endurance born of hope.



