### Why Doubt?

Dear Parishioners:

It was a dark and stormy night. Jesus was alone on a mountain while he sent his disciples into a tempestuous sea. The waves were crashing against the hull, the wind roiled the boat, then suddenly in front of them on the water a man appeared. "It is a ghost," they cried. But Jesus said, "No, it's just me."

Biblical literature had an image of creation. For our ancestors, the image was of a powerful deity imposing order on the chaos made by the sea's wild activity. A recurrent image of creation was God walking on the sea, thus manifesting his power and control. When Jesus walks on water, he is doing what God does.

Hebrew scripture also interprets water as symbolic of demonic forces that are hostile to God. One message that today's passage conveys is that Jesus has a command over evil. Standing firm in turbulent waters, Jesus verifies his Lordship over the created world, too.

Another interpretation sees the story as a metaphor. The boat with the disciples represents the church in the world. The storms stand for the beating the world gives the church until Christ comes, bringing first judgment and fear, then assurance.

Yet another interpretation shows the disciples alone and adrift on the chaotic sea. Because of their fear, they cannot recognize Jesus. They cry out, and Jesus appears to them in a kind of epiphany. Like his later resurrection appearance, he tells them "have no fear."

Matthew reveals here how fear blinds people to the presence of God. To be faithful disciples, our

learning is to approach even situations full of chaos and turbulence with the confidence inspired by God rather than with fear.

It is sometimes difficult to accept Jesus' words "Take heart, it is I. Do not fear." Perhaps incoherent with fear, Peter challenges Jesus to prove it. Up to the challenge, Jesus invites Peter to approach him on the water. Strangely, it is not walking through the waves that frightens Peter – but seeing the strong winds continue to batter the boat undoes him.

A renewed spasm of fear pulls Peter down. This time he does not challenge but pleads with Jesus, "Lord, save me." Through all the doubt, Jesus is present with the willingness to give comforting assurance.

When our practice of faith becomes uncomfortable and then dangerous with the possibility of our sacrificing everything, even our lives, Christ will find us. This week, the church remembers the sacrifice of St. Maximilian Kolbe. A Catholic priest in his mid-40s, Kolbe had been arrested by the Gestapo in Poland after he spoke out against Nazi atrocities. He was imprisoned in Auschwitz. In 1941, he volunteered to take the place of a father who was to be executed as part of a reprisal for another who had escaped. St. Maximilian became a martyr on August 14 his feast day.

Sometimes silence is more than the absence of sound. It is a presence where God dwells. To hear the voice of God, one needs to enter the silence. Allow the chatter of mind and tongue to cease.

In today's first reading nature's greatest displays of power are not the bearers of God's presence. Rather, it is the "still small voice" that arises out of the depths of God's silence. If you want to hear the voice of the Lord, you need enter this silence. It was out of this necessity that Jesus often withdrew from the crowds – and even from his nearest disciples. You cannot hear the voice apart from the silence that forms it.

The solemnity of the Assumption of Mary is Saturday. Belief in Mary's bodily assumption into heaven is meant to reinforce our hope of our own glorious resurrection. Especially when people are in pain or struggle with an addiction, in the times when the body can seem to be the enemy, Christ's resurrection and Mary's assumption confirm that we have God's promise of a new life to come.

Jesus does not condemn those who have little faith. He does not refuse his presence to those who fear. But his question, "Why did you doubt?" challenges us. Remember, he has already proved with his life his desire to save us.

## INTERFAITH MOVEMENT FOR IMMIGRANT JUSTICE

IMIrJ (Interfaith Movement for Immigrant Justice, part of Ecumenical Ministries of Oregon) invites you to join a Sacred Circle from now through the election in November.

**Background info**: Sacred Circles will include learning and sustained action to advance immigrant and racial justice, in coordination with immigrant and Black-led partner organizations as well as other Sacred Circles throughout the state.

The Sacred Circles will meet at least once a month (1.5 hours over Zoom). These gatherings will create space for us to reflect on our values, build relationships with each other, learn and take action together for racial justice. IMIrJ will offer action suggestions that respond to the requests of people of color led partner organizations. Here in Oregon, IMIrJ is in coalitions with and either has or is currently building relationships with Unite Oregon, PAALF (The Portland African American Leadership Forum), and the Coalition of Communities of Color - all of which have Black leadership and/or members/base. Nationally we are looking to the Movement for Black Lives for political analysis and direction. IMIrJ is an active member of the One Oregon and Oregon Ready coalitions, and the Portland Police Reform Network. IMIrJ also has close working relationships with many local people of color-led groups, such as Adelante Mujeres in Washington County, Yamhill County's Unidos Bridging Community, the Latino Association Community in Bend, etc. Internally, they are forming a new IMIrJ Clergy of Color Caucus that will work closely with IMIrJ staff.
