Dear Parishioners:

I turn to you, Lord, in time of trouble, and you fill me with the joy of salvation. Ps. 32

"In time of trouble" Lent 2021 is already a desert of troubles -- what with the pandemic and roiling political world and renewed call for racial justice. No need for a special desert season this year to call you back to God. When Jesus experienced his sojourn in the desert of the first Lent, the Spirit helped him. Are you ready to bring your troubles to the Lord – to experience the Spirit helping you?



Everyone experiences losses. Perhaps a family member has died, or a dear friend has moved out of town, or that job you've had for ten years has suddenly been eliminated. Does the Spirit meet you in your grief and sadness and mourning?

Everyone experiences disappointments. Perhaps you were counting on a promotion that went to somebody else. Or you didn't get accepted into that school with just the program you wanted. Or your reliably good health suddenly went south for the winter. Does the Spirit urge you to fast from discouragement and feast on hope?

Everyone experiences conflicts and frustration. Maybe some in your household think they are not only always right, but constantly feel entitled to point out when you are wrong. Maybe the mantra runs through your mind, "I wish I

Lent is the beginning of the Catholic church's annual retreat. Especially during these troubled times, it's good to recall Lent's purpose, which is *conversion*. Conversion is God's gift to us singly and communally -- the gift of closer intimacy with the Holy One and with one another. Conversion focuses on what we need change *from* and change *to*. This Lent I'd like to invite us to consider a change from *isolation*.

Isolation is not the same as being solitary or separated from your dear ones. You can be surrounded by people and yet still be isolated from connecting with others. Isolation comes from secret brokenness, from fear, and from recurrent sin -- from self-imposed barriers of shame, guilt, or dread of being found out. And I'd like us also to consider what we want to move toward this Lent: *caring for one another*.

Lent can be a season of healing, and of honoring your deepest desire for acceptance.

Everyone needs bonds of belonging. Everyone needs ties of familiarity and companionship and mutual regard. This is the stuff of conversion.

During Lent, the Spirit takes the blinders from your eyes. You see how sin is the refusal to let your life be a gift for others. Sin means using your talents and energies as if you were the only one with a life in the world. The specifics of how this refusal plays out is as unique as everyone's fingerprints. This is where Jesus helps -- to manifest the mystery of your refusals, then to give courage, light, and energy to countervail them.

Jesus helps to show your sources of isolation, and reveals how to embrace your gifts to bless others. The annual Lenten practice helps you claim your best aspirations, acknowledge your darkest selfishness, and take courage in companionship with Jesus on your journey home to God.

If you go to Lenten confession, tell the priest not only your weakness, but your dreams as well as your desire for healing. And the priest will speak words of patience and encouragement, both as representative of the faith community and as embodiment of the healing presence of Christ. Instead of a weekly list of sins and no change, this once yearly encounter to diagnose the roots of your light and darkness can actually promote conversion.

My prayer this year is that your Lent can be about conversion – letting the Spirit work in you. *May you turn to the Lord in times of trouble, and experience the joy of salvation.*

Students had a true snow day during our storm last week. Every year we have snow days built into our calendar, but with distance learning, many thought snow days were a thing of the past. However, we felt strongly that our children have lost so much this year, it was important that they not lose the magic of a snow day. We heard many stories of sledding and snowmen being built. We saw pictures of students bundled up and having more fun than they have in months. We are so grateful that they were able to feel so much joy on this day.

Many families within our community were dealing with the loss of power. We are so thankful to all of the brave people who worked tirelessly to get the power back on. The school building lost power for a while, and lost internet for a few days. With the vast majority of our students in distance learning, having school without the internet these days is not possible. We had to take another day Wednesday while we waited for the internet to be restored.

Our 8th graders were disappointed to miss out on the Ash Wednesday Mass, but they are looking forward to rejoining us on campus in less than a month! Students received their Transition Project boxes this week. During Lent, our students collect money in these boxes and then return them on Good Friday. The money collected is used to provide meals for Transition Projects. The school has been working with Transition Projects for decades now, and it is a privilege to be a part of such a wonderful organization.

Looking ahead, we have fourth graders returning to campus this week. We have been in the "pause" phase of our reopening. We are happy with the safety measures and protocols in place, and we have had no transmission of COVID-19 in the school. This is also because our families are doing their part to keep everyone safe. This is truly a community effort to keep our school open and safe for all.
