A Message from the Pastor

When my mother died, some nineteen years ago, I flew from Spokane to Phoenix and got to my sister Maureen's house about thirty minutes after she had died. When I went into her room, the Hospice Nurse was there. I thanked her for her incredible care of my mother during those last days. She looked at me and said, "Oh no, it is I who should thank all of you. Your mother died a beautiful death. She was at peace." My sisters shared with me my mother's last wish—"I want you kids—mind you, we were all in our late 50s or mid 60s—I want you kids to stay close to one another. Take care of one another." That would be easy to do since she had taught us well through her words and her example.

The context of our Gospel reading, this weekend, is the Last Supper. Jesus is aware that he will soon be taken, suffer and die. Jesus is aware of how devastating this will be on his disciples. And so, his last words to them are important words. His last wish for them tells us a lot about his heart. His last hope for them is "Peace." When he has risen from the dead and appears to them, and they are simply bewildered by these events, his first words to them will be "Peace."

The peace that the Risen Jesus leaves us is not a passive acquiescence or the absence of hostility or conflict. The peace of Jesus is a mindset—a constant seeking out of God's love, justice, and mercy; an understanding of our "connectedness" to God and to one another as children of the same God. Christ's peace is much more than a "spiritual tranquilizer" (Thomas Merton) or a mental or emotional garrison we construct to protect us from unpleasant conflict. To embrace Christ's gift of peace is to understand and celebrate that connectedness to one another as children of the same God in whose love and justice we center our attitudes and values. The peace of the Easter Christ is the awareness of God's presence in every moment of our lives, the confidence that our hope in the things of God will be realized, the assurance that the love of God is ours. Christ's peace is a perspective that informs all our actions, behaviors, and values—to live Christ's peace is to understand our responsibility to the common good and provide our share



not from our surplus but from our need. The peace of the Risen One is to realize and honor God's hand in all things, protecting and unifying all the world.

"But," our minds argue, "there is so much in our lives and our world that rob us of any possible peace." Think of what the Coronavirus has done to our health, our way of living and relating, and any plans we might have for the future. In the past two years, this virus has turned our world upside down. Think of the violent invasion and destruction of Ukraine. Think of the people you know who are supporting and caring for loved ones fighting cancer. Think of the victims of violence and abuse in our city, our country, and our world. Think of your friends who daily deal with the stress of lost jobs, lost homes, lost income. There is so much that can disturb us and rob us of peace. Perhaps that is why Jesus says to his disciples, "Not as the world gives do I give it to you."

In almost every Recovery Meeting, the participants who gather begin with a prayer for peace—"God, grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change; the courage to change the things I can; and the wisdom to know the difference." The peace that Jesus wishes for us—his disciples—demands courage and wisdom. Our lives, at times, are out of control and we are powerless to change them. Our world, at times, is out of control and we are powerless to change it. So, what is the response of those in recovery? "Therefore, I will yield to a higher power." What Jesus gives us, through his resurrection and ascension, is the gift of his Spirit. That Spirit has the power to transform our minds, our hearts, our lives, and our world. The gift of this Spirit is peace.

Let us pray for the gift of this Spirit and this peace, in the words of this old Celtic blessing.
