Wisdom from the Pews

The scriptures this week are not Sunday picnic small talk. They are not for the faint of heart. They remind me of being on a team and the game isn't going well. The players are grumbling, tired, and want some reassurance. The coaches, patient and wise, are not sugar coating things: "Here's the game plan (again)." Or, as one of my high school teachers often said

in his raised Irish brogue, "I'm just after tellin' you."

First, Habakkuk laments to God that there is a ton of turmoil, violence, and injustice happening. Judah has been invaded again and Jerusalem destroyed. And you, God, aren't doing anything. Being honest, I feel the same way about these times we're in. There is destruction and injustice all around us. Do vou see what I see, O Lord? But the Lord answered Habakkuk: "Here is the plan: the vision will be fulfilled. You won't be disappointed. You must wait for it. You must be patient." Darn, there is that patience virtue again. Time and again, God says, "Your ways are not my ways," and "A thousand years for the Lord is but a day." That is hard to accept. But God lays it out there: you must have faith, you must be just, you must work the plan.

Paul continues today's blunt assessment. You are not cowards. But you must stir your gifts into flame. Continuing the analogy, you have to bear the hardships of the game. You must appreciate, guard, and use your gifts. Your gifts from God. You must guard, i.e., have faith in this rich trust. You must work on the plan.

Luke in his gospel tells us one way of working on the plan. The apostles want their faith increased. Perhaps they hadn't heard of the prophet Habakkuk's vision from God imploring patience and personal maintenance of justice. Besides, they have Jesus, the head coach in their midst, ready to explain the plan with yet another parable.

The servant (representing us) has just come in from a hard day of plowing

and tending sheep. Hard, sweaty jobs as they were then, and still are. The servant is tired and hungry and wants to eat, drink, and relax. But the landlord says, not so fast; you have to fix me dinner first. And then you can eat when I'm finished. Really? I can imagine the servant is more than a bit ticked. You mean I have more work to do? Well, yes you do. You have to work, and then work more, serving the landlord (and others.) That will increase your faith. I'm guessing that is not the answer the apostles were neither looking for nor expecting. No sugar-coating.



My take on the entirety of today's scriptures is that we have been blessed with faith in, and love for, Christ Jesus. But this faith must be nourished to grow, and that requires hard work. Frequently it's repetitious and unglamorous. We have gifts of the Spirit to sustain us. We need patience, to trust and to do justice. The work is hard, but the vision will be fulfilled.




