What Do You Do When Life Is Hard?

Dear Parishioners:

With the church throughout the whole world, St. Ignatius parish dedicates the month of October to the rosary and to respect for the sacredness of life in all its stages. We joyfully pledge our support for the unborn, the terminally ill, the developmentally disabled – all those considered disposable in a utilitarian world.

Our readings this weekend support our vision of the sanctity of human life. Life is holy because it comes from God and is destined to return to God. In our increasingly faithless world, there are many competing voices that dismiss God's vision for us. Conflicts abound. Even when life is hard, God promises rescue.

Even in the face of political turmoil and broken trust, the prophet Habakkuk insists that God's "vision still has its time, presses on to fulfillment, and will not disappoint." The psalmist likewise encourages us to be faithful to the promptings of God's Spirit. St. Paul urges us to bear our share of "hardship for the gospel with the strength that comes from God."

What is the way to respond to conflicts? With faith. Jesus reminds his hearers that even a little faith can work wonders. Our call is to serve the Lord and one another – especially when all seems lost. Our duty is to do what God commands us, even if that involves embracing the cross of opposition.

A famous quote illustrates this point. Anyone who has attended an AA meeting knows the prayer first written by Reinhold Neibuhr: "Lord, give me the courage to change the things I can, the patience to accept the things I cannot, and the wisdom to know the difference." But did you know how that prayer ends? "Help me take, as Christ did, this sinful world as it is, and not as I would have it – trusting that He will make all things right, if I surrender to his will."

Faith can move mountains, but not without our cooperation. If first you and I do our part, however small, then God will do the rest.

The problem is that life is not easy. The Gospel recounts the story about the master and the slave. After the poor slave had worked all day, the master still expected him to get him dinner before the slave got dinner for himself. And then don't expect praise. "You were only doing your duty." And notice the ones Jesus was addressing – the *apostles*, the inner circle. Then as now, church leaders especially are to be the servants of all.

Life is essentially hard. Think of all the things children have to learn before they are ready to raise children themselves. Life is for striving. Realistically speaking, life gets ever more complicated for adults – and can become quite difficult for elders from the infirmities of old age. Expecting that life is going to get easier is an exercise in futility. This is where faith comes in.

You recall that today's gospel began with a request: "Lord, increase our faith." In response, Jesus recounted the unfair and even callous situation of duties upon duties, about appalling inequity of ceaseless demands from master over slave. What is the connection? Jesus was teaching that faith would not make life easier. It did not make his life easier. Why should it be different for us? The purpose of faith is to make people stronger – so they become equal to the ever-increasing demands of life.

Eulalie's Garden honors Blessed Mother Marie Rose, the foundress of the Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary. Her birthday and feast day are Oct. 6.

Mother Marie Rose was born Eulalie Durocher in 1811 to a well-respected family in Saint-Antoine-sur-Richelieu (Québec). Despite her frailty, she was a lively and joyous child. As a teenager, Eulalie proudly rode her beautiful horse Caesar to visit friends, the sick, and the less fortunate in her village. After many obstacles, she became the foundress of the Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary. According to her vision, each child must receive a well-rounded education: spiritually, academically, artistically and socially. On the occasion of her beatification in Rome on May 23, 1982, the Church declared Marie-Rose Durocher an apostolic woman and a herald of new times. In naming the new Child Development Center at our parish school, "Eulalie's Garden", we honor the spirit of who she was as a child and who she became. Two additional CASE Trainings will be offered at St. Ignatius: Tuesday, **October 22nd @ 5:30PM** Both classes will be held in the school library and will be **capped at 30 people**. **Call the office to get on the list**, drop-ins will not be admitted. This class is a requirement of the Archdiocese of Portland and needs to be completed by October 31st to volunteer on our campus for the rest of this school year.
