
A Message from the Pastor

I came across an article that appeared in a journal for Alabama lawyers. It was written by a judge and it dealt with the Top Ten Things Attorneys Should Never Say to Judges. The first was this—"With all due respect, your honor," because it is a prelude to disagreeing or objecting—both of which show no respect. The second is, "I'm not prepared today because. . . ."

If Jesus walked by us while we were casting our nets into the sea and said, "Follow me," I wonder how many of us would be tempted to say, "With all due respect, Rabbi, I'm not prepared to follow you today because. . . ." I like time to consider invitations. I like time to reflect on what all my options are. I like time to consider the ramifications of saying "Yes" or "No" to the invitation. I simply like time to mull things over. You may call this "a delaying tactic," but I simply don't like to rush into things before considering both options and consequences.

In Matthew, Luke or John's gospel, we are given time—as much as four chapters—to get used to the idea, to meet the one who's going to be inviting, to examine his background, and to sense something of what the risks will be in accepting the invitation. Mark's gospel seeks to convey the urgency of Jesus' mission and message. This is the gospel whose favorite word is "immediately." Mark uses the word "straightaway" or "immediately" over forty times in his sixteen chapters. It occurs several times just in the first chapter—"The Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness"(1:12); "Immediately they left their nets and followed him"(1:18); "Immediately he called them"(1:20); "Immediately on the Sabbath he entered the synagogue and taught"(1:21); "Immediately the leprosy left him"(1:42).

As Alyce McKenzie points out, Mark wants to get on with it. So, we shouldn't be surprised that he takes the remote and fast-forwards to the scene he chooses as the starting point of his gospel: "John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness. . ." He gives us a line or two of description of Jesus, then it's baptism, temptation and you're on—"Follow me." This is our cue. Are we going to drop our nets, leave Dad in the boat and follow Jesus? Or are we going to say, "With all due respect, your honor, I'm not prepared to respond today because. . . ."

That's often how life comes at us. Death comes to a loved one and we say, "I'm not prepared to deal with death today." We find out we're going to be a parent and we may say, "This is wonderful news, but I'm not prepared to be a parent today." It's like that student in graduate studies who postpones his comprehensives because there is so much more he or she has to learn—"I don't know everything there is to know about my subject. I'm not prepared to be examined today." A new opportunity knocks on our door, and we say, "I'm not prepared to answer the door today because...." When life calls upon us to change, to risk, our response is often, "I'm not prepared to change today. I'm not prepared to risk today. I'm simply not prepared."



This is how Jesus comes at us. "Follow me," he says. He doesn't' ask to see our curriculum vitae. He doesn't check our references. He doesn't ask to see a sample of our work. He doesn't make us audition or run timed sprints or submit a personal vision statement. As this weekend's gospel

reminds us, Jesus just calls—and the disciples just followed. Who knows, maybe we will too.

Our students are enjoying climbing around on the new play structure we

installed this month as the final part of our *Playground Renovation Project*.

Our students are learning and growing each and every day! This week, students are learning the virtues of affability and courtesy. They are practicing being joyful, kind, and friendly toward all. The students learn about some of the saints that model affability and courtesy such as St. Francis of Assisi, St. Nicholas, St. Rose of Li-

ma, and St. Vincent de Paul.

For more than 85 years, the Italian Dinner at St Ignatius would happen every year on the Sunday of President's Day-weekend. People would start to arrive after the early Sunday Masses and line up for tickets to an event that was dear to my heart as well as to many others. They would look forward to the homemade meatballs, ravioli, spaghetti, and delicious sauce served along with salad, bread and garlic butter, with an ice cream for dessert! The food was good, but mostly people came from all over to partake of the community. People came back year after year. This fundraiser had a life of its own!

Over the years, however, it has been increasingly harder to find volunteers to take on the key roles of this event. Most of the Heads of committees must gather their supplies, set up their stations, find volunteers for a long day of service, and then serve all day too.

There were people that stayed long after the dinner. They helped clean up (and spaghetti can be messy). Sometimes we would be cleaning sauce off of the walls well into the night!! Then the Monday after the dinner, there was another full day of making sure the whole hall was put back in working order for the following Tuesday!

Over the years many difficult decisions were made regarding this dinner to simplify it. They no longer make the raviolis by hand. We can no longer make homemade desserts. We added washing stations, a liaison for the Health Department, and much more.



Steven O'Neill and Alyssa Frangipani have worked hard to revive this Italian Dinner. But unfortunately, there are just too many holes to fill, and not enough volunteers or time to fill them. This is simply part of our post pandemic reality.

We have come to the realization that this amount of work is hard to ask of people now a days. They all have different working situations and responsibilities that already keep them busy. This year, due to death or people moving away, we have had turnover of some of our key Committee heads and there is no training available for these roles. So, I believe it is time to celebrate what was—85 plus years of a wonderful success—and look to the future in a new way, with new ideas.
