A Message from the Pastor


A very dear friend of mine, my first orthopedic surgeon, golf-addicted like me, and travel companion on a number of my adventures including Turkey, is Dr. Ramon Jimenez. When I was teaching at Santa Clara University, there was a fundraiser for a local Catholic Girls High School. Twenty Trivial Pursuit teams vied for the victor's crown.

There were eight members of each team. Ramon invited six Jesuits from Santa Clara University who all had doctorates in different academic disciplines, as well as more than a passing knowledge of such topics as sports, science, history, literature, films, and entertainment. Ramon was confident that his "Dream Team" would carry off the top prize. We finished dead last. We could have answered every question that the other nineteen teams were asked. The questions we drew, however, were simply "jawbreakers."

Beware of expectations—especially during this Christmas season. Where is Emmanuel born? Not is the city of Kings (Jerusalem) but in the lowly town of Bethlehem. Who are the first to welcome the Son of God? Not the Scribes. Not the Pharisees. Not the local learned gentry. Shepherds in the fields are the first

to hear the good news and come to welcome the new born king.

The local King wanted to exterminate this new born king who threatened his own rule. There were Three Wise Men, people with the equivalent of Ph.D.'s in Astrology, who might have been chosen for Ramon's "Dream Team." But what did they come all that way to see? Why did they put up with all the suffering and discomfort of travel to follow a star? What were they expecting to find?

Whatever their expectations, they brought gifts of gold (the most valuable metal on earth, a symbol of divinity, the ultimate gift and perfect offering to royalty), frankincense (which comes from a small tree only found in Arabia and northern Africa and was used as an all-purpose medicine, the perfect gift for "the healer of our every ill"), and myrrh (an expensive extract from the resin of the myrrh tree that was used as a medicine and, more significantly, in embalming the dead—a gift reserved for kings). Did the Three Kings' experience live up to their expectations?

Despite Ramon's protestations, Mary and Joseph and the baby Jesus would not have made our Dream Team. The Shepherds definitely wouldn't have made our Dream Team. The Three Wise Men had a very remote chance of making our Dream Team. Of course, our Dream Team finished tied for last.

The German theologian, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, once wrote: "If it is I who determine where God is to be found, then I shall always find a God who corresponds to me in some way, who is obliging, who is connected

with my own nature. But if God determines where he is to be found, then it will be in a place which is not immediately pleasing to my nature and which is not at all congenial to me." This place is the manger whose wood prefigures the wood of the cross. We need to join the Holy Family, the Shepherds and the visiting Wise Men kneeling at the manger. And we must prepare ourselves to stand at the foot of the cross. For the time being, however, simply "follow that star" and trust where it leads you.

With the Exercises, we might grow in these gifts: wisdom and discernment – and live out the virtue of Prudence.
