## Set the Earth on Fire

Dear Parishioners:

As Augustine once wrote, “To fall in love with God is the greatest romance; to seek God, the greatest adventure; to find God, the greatest human achievement.” Is this what Jesus had in mind when he says in today’s gospel, *I have come to set the world on fire?*

Picture a blazing bonfire outside St. Ignatius church. Young and old surround it. With the Paschal candle held high, everyone enters the ritual of this sacred night. The Paschal candle is lit from the blazing fire.

The assembly follows the Paschal candle carrying their own unlit candles. A voice intones “Christ our light!” All respond, “Thanks be to God.” The flame from the large candle is shared, and gradually the light spreads as the large candle moves further up the aisle. Reaching the front of the church, there is a final intonation “Christ our Light!” The church now blazes with candles lit from the one candle lit from that enormous bonfire. *I have come to set the world on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing.*

Cosmologists say that at the dawn of creation was the Big Bang, an explosion of fire and creative energy. Fire is a primordial element. Without the glowing hot furnace of our sun, life on earth could not survive. The very interior of our planet is a molten mass of fiery magma that comes to the surface through volcanoes. Fire creates and cleanses as well as destroys. Yet before anything else to exist, there must first be fire.

The disciples on the road to Emmaus reflected on their interaction with the Stranger. “Were not our hearts burning within us?” Their lives caught fire as Jesus explained his mission. They were never the same again.

At your baptism, your godparents received for you a candle burning with a flame from the Paschal candle. “Receive the Light of Christ. Keep it burning brightly until the Lord comes to meet you in the life of God.”

Jesus knew the power of the divine fire burning within him. Jesus identified his mission as a great baptism of fire. This baptism would include fire’s cleansing and destructive qualities as well as fire’s creative and light-bearing power. The fire of the Spirit in Jesus burned away sin’s destructive effects – clearing the way for the human family’s new era of grace.

It’s clear that people need the light and warmth of the fire of the sun to nurture life and to cleanse from what destroys life. Yet you cannot look directly at the sun – you need a lens to protect you from the sun’s overwhelming light. Jesus is that lens for believers.

Jesus explains how the fire he is casting on the earth will have various outcomes. Not everyone will accept the fire of his message. To approach the searing sun of Gospel grace, you need the lens of Jesus. Some cannot accept what they see through Jesus, and go their own way. There will be division – the fire of the Gospel will divide members of the same household.

Consider today’s complex tensions within families and communities, and between political parties and nations. Simple courtesy and respectful dialogue seem to be the casualties of our contentious political and religious discourse. Now more than ever, Christ’s fire of forbearance and respect need to blaze in you.

Although peace and promises of peace are certainly part of Jesus’ message, today’s readings make it clear that there can be no peace without struggle, and no salvation without suffering.

Recall that Jesus is on his path to Jerusalem, to his final hour. Jesus has been teaching what discipleship involves. It requires looking straight ahead, forsaking even family obligations. It means seeing all persons, no matter how lowly, as worthy and capable of love. It involves listening and sharing hospitality. It requires trust in God’s goodness. It is demanding, requiring total devotion and the surrender of money and possessions. It means sharing resources with those in need. It means being always watchful, always ready, always “slave” to the Master. It is not easy.

In his *Celebration* commentary for this Sunday, deacon Ross Beaudoin quoted the Jesuit paleontologist Teilhard de Chardin: “Someday, after mastering the winds, the waves, the tides and gravity, we shall harness for God the energies of love. And then, for the second time in the history of the world, man will have discovered fire.”
