Wisdom from the Pews

I am the son of a coach wired to think in terms of sports metaphors and my ears perked up when Paul wrote to Timothy "I have competed well; I have finished the race; I have kept the faith." Honestly, I'm unsure about my own race and that I stumble to maintain my faith and personal relationship with Jesus.

During a recent run I was struggling and felt strangely alone in my physical suffering even though my partner was running beside me. At some point I felt the strength God invests in me and that it is He, as Timothy says, that "rescue[s] me from every evil threat and will bring me safe to his heavenly kingdom." In between shaky breaths I thought about the span and measure of my life's race and that God rescued me from myriad threats...including collapsing while running!

"I have kept the faith" is such a simple and complex phrase. On the one hand, as a Red Sox fan, I know well how to keep the faith during times good and bad. On the other hand, God and his messengers are not playing games, and Paul's final letter is a high-stakes communication sent to his acolyte and friend Timothy.

Paul, imprisoned in his home in Rome for professing his faith, is nearing his death when he writes to Timothy. When I close my eyes to center this scene in my heart, I'm overcome with the sadness that Timothy may have felt towards his mentor. Perhaps Timothy felt alone

and pained, realizing it is now his race to run. Paul began his race of evangelism on the road to Damascus, in present-day Syria, and ran (or at least walked) several laps around what is today Israel, Palestine, Lebanon, Turkey, Greece, Macedonia, all the way to Italy. I can scarcely imagine the perseverance it must have taken Paul to hold fast to the notion that a "crown of righteousness" awaits him in heaven.

Running is an act of perseverance and can sometimes feel like a self-inflicted punishment. In the past, I saw Paul's impending death as a sort of self-inflicted wound that he must bear alone. God is not a petty punisher, and Paul's words attune me to the fact that it is He who accompanied Paul on his final lap Home.

We are never alone - God is running with us, offering us a baton of faith and spirit, not too dissimilar from Paul symbolically passing the baton of mission to Timothy. All we need is to stretch out our hand to accept it.

Sirach writes that "...he is a God who always repays and will give back to you sevenfold." As we gather this Sunday to hear the word of God, consider how your own race of faith is going. Remember: we are all in this together, akin to a relay race, joyfully handing the baton of faith and fellowship off to one another.

You may have noticed the new ADA ramp for the church parking lot. The new ramp is to provide a safer entrance from the parking lot to the sidewalk, as

well as bringing it up to the current building code. Additionally, we now have a van accessible parking space. This is the first part of a plan to improve our ADA entrance with our goal to have a barrier free unassisted wheelchair entrance to the church.

The school is constantly changing with the ever-changing digital age. Slowly we have been replacing the old smart boards used for visual teaching aides to new high-definition video screens in the classrooms. This provides the teachers with many more tools and resources that are current to today's curriculum.

Thanks to the Archdiocese's Safety Grant program we were able to change out the old T8 fluorescent light bulbs to new LED light bulbs in Dillon Hall. This will cut our energy use for lighting in Dillon by half. Additionally, in the school, we were able to change out the classroom door hardware to new intruder protection hardware that is also ADA compliant.




