Wisdom from the Pews

Days like this must make heaven smile. All over the world, preachers, teachers, writers, and readers are connecting a story that went viral 2000 years ago to International Women's Day in 2026. The line up of March 8th, the official date of International Women's Day, on a Sunday, with a Gospel reading about Jesus conversing with an outcast woman at a well happens less than 14 times a century.

Gratefully, our Catholic Church observes International Women's

Day by celebrating the "complementary dignity" of women and our vital roles in the Church and Society. We are all called to learn more about the global and historical struggle of women for justice and equality. We are all summoned to fight the poverty and violence that oppress women's lives.

The Woman, the well, and the water. There is so much to pray about here. As we know, Jesus "**would never speak to them except in parables,**" Matthew 13:34. Additionally, John is known to have used symbolism in the Gospel writings attributed to him. (e.g., "**The Woman put down her water jar and hurried back to the town to tell the people.**" She left her old life behind.) Jesus and John were perhaps pioneers in using metaphor strategically to prompt individual and structural change.

The Samaritan Woman represents many people who suffer discrimination and injustice due to gender, culture, and social norms. Norms that persist. The well is real, deep, and has a long and sustaining history, much like what the beautifully and humbly written 1995 General Congregation 34 Documents of the Society of Jesus call "The Situation of Women in the Church and Civil Society." That deep and actual well is named for Jacob, the guy who wrestled God through the night. Jacob's nocturnal fight is cited by Colleen Dulle, a Vatican Reporter, in her book, *Struck Down, Not Destroyed*, as she tells of her own wrestling with faith when she has had to report on soul-distressing issues and Church news. "I remember being struck by how long a night is," she writes.

But it is the Living Water that makes

me cry. We all thirst. We are thirsty to be met with hospitality instead of expected hostility, because of who we are, when we come to the well. Thirsty to have our complex histories of survival understood and not shamed when we come to the well. Thirsty to be individually and institutionally transformed by the Grace of God, for the better, the just, the equal. Thirsty for opportunities to use and be beneficiaries of all our God-given gifts as the Living Water of our Baptisms intend. Thirsty for a new dawn after the long night. Thirsty to put our old water jars down, hurry back to town with the blessing of Jesus, proclaiming the profoundly Good News that we will never be thirsty again. Happy International Women's Day!


During Lent, every Sunday from 6:15-6:45PM, you are invited to be with Christ through the intimate prayer of Adoration.




ST. IGNATIUS SCHOOL
