For this Sunday, the 22nd in Ordinary Time, the Gospel offers a message on humility, that we should not crave the position of the honored but take the lowest position. This message contradicts so much of what our earthly lives tell us, that we are "number 1," the best, the richest, the smartest, etc. We so often strive to be more, to want more, to be the one at the seat of honor at a feast. Is that not what we tend toward celebrating every day? We give prizes for coming in first; we recognize the person who brought in the most business; we put up bumper stickers proclaiming our child for being the valedictorian. Do not get me wrong. Encouragement and praise are part of sharing our love and appreciation of another person. Indeed, it is our duty to acknowledge and celebrate the gifts that God grants us - the joyful laughter of children, the happiness of baby animals, love so deep our grief changes the shape of our hearts, the beauty of a voice that can bring tears (Joseph's!), or a silence in the woods so profound, we cannot help

but look at the trees around us in awe.

The message of the Gospel, however, goes beyond that of our earthly lives. It calls for us to go deeper, to reflect on our spiritual selves. It is from this lowest position that we are granted the wisdom

from God to see the pain and suffering in this world so that we might better understand what God wants us to do. It is when we put ourselves last that we are truly listening. As many wise ones have said, it is when we lose ourselves that we become one with God. Jesus is our greatest mentor, He, who ultimately sacrificed his "self"

as his Father wished. And true to our saints and martyrs, and the great leaders before us who walked away from "success" and "wealth" — St Augustine, St



Clare, St Ignatius, Buddha, St Francis, etc.,—they did what ordinary beings would call foolish or irresponsible acts.

It takes courage to come to this place, a place that tells us to ignore much of what we know of earthly life. It comes from prayer. meditation, and contemplation. It is a scary place to hear the voice of God. I continue to fail to put myself last daily. But I am working on it through prayer and contemplation. I know that when humility is thus nurtured, I can start to understand that all the prizes related to being "number 1" do not matter. Recognition for human achievements almost becomes an embarrassment. The prize of being brought to the highest seat by the host is just that - the prize of KNOWING that our joyful purpose is to serve God!

Transformational Retreat in Everyday Life


Make a Year-end Donation to St. Ignatius Parish!

If you are age 73 or older, the IRS requires you to take required minimum distributions each year from your tax-deferred retirement accounts. A qualified charitable donation (QCD) is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA, payable directly to a qualified charity such as St. Ignatius Parish. 
