A Message from the Pastor

Steve Garnaas-Holmes, in his poem *The Heart of It*, reflects on this weekend's gospel.

Jesus is not skipping the law, nor reinterpreting it. He's getting at the heart of it: not a rule you can get around, but an invitation to love. He's drawing us deeper into it, into actually caring about the other person, not just making sure we're legal.

So many issues challenge us to reflect on our values – not just personal values but values as a people, as a community. How will we provide quality health care for all our people? How will we become a community that works to bring an end of racism and other forms of discrimination? How will we respect the dignity of the LGBTQ brothers and sisters? How will we welcome immigrants and refugees? How will we create a nation that works for peace and nonviolence in our relationships? How do we work to protect our planet and all its creatures? Answers are never easy. The challenges are real. However, the call of Christ is clear in our scriptures and especially in the Sermon on the Mount.

Jesus offers us an invitation to live by the highest moral standards. Jesus invites us to go beyond laws and prohibitions to something deeper. Jesus invites us to enter into a profound respect for all of our sisters and brothers. Jesus invites us to move beyond the law into love – into relationship. Jesus invites us to be in community with one another.

The gospel today is not just about personal moral behavior. It is about how we live together and work together as a community. It is about how we live together as nations, as ethnic groups, as corporations, as institutions, as people doing things together. The gospel today invites us to treat one another with mutual care and respect. No person must be treated as an object whether it is a sex object or a marketing object or a tool in a corporate plan for profits. The same applies to how we treat the creation God has given us to share.

Pastor's Message continued from page one:

The gospel today invites us to active nonviolence. We are called to put an end to the ways of and preparations for war and violence. We are not called to be passive in the face of injustice and evil. We are called to be active and to respond in love and respect for the other.

The gospel today is about engaging in the work of reconciliation. This means taking the time to listen to one another. This means making the effort to understand others. This means forgiving others and ourselves. This means speaking up for justice. This means working at the difficult challenge of community.

In Greek mythology, Sisyphus would endlessly attempt to push a big bolder up a mountain. He would never accomplish this task. He would always be frustrated and ultimately fail in his attempt. In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus gives all of would-be disciples challenging work to do—the work to go deeper, the work of love. But Jesus also gives us the means and strength to accomplish this task—however imperfectly. We find that means and strength in the scriptures we hear each week, in the Eucharist we share each week, in the community we only gradually become each week.


So, let us pray for the grace to become what Jesus calls us to be—a community of beloved disciples.

Gentle our hearts, Loving One.
Ease our violence into its grave.
Wash our fury clean with compassion,
to see the other as your wounded child.
Turn our anger into the courage to love.

Even the most awful person has a story, a wound, a soul—perhaps so shrunken in fear and pain it has become a stone—but still a soul, your Beloved.

Give us wisdom to understand, and grace to meet pain and fear with healing, to be angry at injustice but not at people, to resist evil with love, to act boldly, but only with love. God of resolute gentleness, help us not to murder,




