#### A Message from the Pastor

Theologian, storyteller, and poet John Shea captured three of Jesus' resurrection appearances in a poem—the appearance to Mary Magdalene where she mistook him for a Gardener; the appearance to Peter by the Lake of Tiberias where Jesus became the questioner and healer; and the appearance to the two Disciples of Emmaus when Jesus appeared to them as a stranger. Listen to John Shea's lines about this weekend's gospel.

> In Peter's dreams the cock still crowed. He returned to Galilee to throw nets into the sea and watch them sink like memories into darkness. He did not curse the sun that rolled down his back or the wind that drove the fish beyond his nets. He only waited for the morning when the shore mist would lift and from his boat he would see him. Then after naked and impetuous swim with the sea running from his eyes he would find a cook with holes in his hands and stooped over dawn coal who would offer him the Kingdom of God for breakfast.

#### **PASTOR'S MESSAGE CONTINUED FROM PAGE ONE:**

The story of Peter's triple denial of Christ is recorded in each of the four gospels. Only in John's gospel do we have this beautiful account of an early morning breakfast by the Lake of Tiberias; an after-meal walk along the beach during which Jesus asks his question to Peter three times, "Do you love me?"; and Jesus reissuing his invitation and call to Peter, the one who will be the Shepherd when Jesus ascends to the Father. We are so fortunate, as a faith community, to have this story of denial, betrayal, forgiveness, healing, and mission by the original "Rock" of Jesus' apostles—Peter. It is like watching one of the great golfers of the world missing a two foot put on the greens of Augusta. Our response is—well, even I could do that.


When someone points out that "It is the Lord" to Peter, his love for Christ impels him to jump into the water and make for shore to be with him. His actions in this story express his love for the Teacher. But Jesus knows that memory and shame of Peter's denials during Christ's passion, will prevent him from the new life and hope and mission that are the resurrection. And so, Jesus asks Peter, "Do you love me?" three times. Peter had denied his Lord three times and it was three times that Jesus gave Peter an opportunity to affirm his love. Jesus, in his gracious forgiveness of Peter and of us, gives Peter and us a chance to wipe out any memory of denial by a threefold declaration of love.

But Peter and our response brings us a mission—"Feed my lambs. Feed my sheep." We can prove that we love Jesus only by loving others. Love is the greatest privilege in the world, but it brings the greatest responsibility. So how can we, today, feed Christ's sheep? I believe we demonstrate our love for Jesus and feed his sheep every time parents bring children into this world and discover the meaning of sacrificial love—when parents put their likes and desires and comforts aside to raise their children—who can bring them great joy and great challenge, at times. I believe we demonstrate our love for Jesus and feed his sheep every time we don't simply stand in judgment of the poor and the hungry all around us but feed them, listen to them, show compassion for them, stand with them, become a voice they do not have, share a power they simply do not enjoy.
