Jesus Wants It All

Dear Parishioners:

On this Welcome Back weekend, Jesus wants a commitment. He wants to be your partner, companion, and friend in a new way. Three years ago, you heard the invitation to consider the best option to accomplish campus renewal – (1) to construct apartments for seniors as a source of revenue for the other projects; or (2) to raise money from fund-raising and build in phases over several years. The archdiocese wants us to pursue the second course.

Scripture today invites your pledge to make Christ the center of your heart by taking responsibility for the future of the parish in a new way. Next weekend, parish leadership will discuss strategic planning for how you and I will accomplish our Jesuit parish mission together.

As the school bells ring out once again to beckon the children to their classrooms, this autumn will provide new opportunities for everyone to practice the daily examination of conscience that St. Ignatius taught his first Jesuits. This sensitivity to the workings of the divine Spirit in your mind and heart is the foundation for your role as a stakeholder in the projects the parish plans to undertake. As fall unfolds, watch for more information about the practice of Ignatian core values (finding God in all things, seeking God’s greater glory, making a daily examen to discover God’s action in your soul).

In today’s gospel from Luke, Jesus knows that the crowd surrounding him is not ready for the journey that awaits them as his followers. If he does not prepare them for the harsh times ahead, he realizes they will wilt under pressure. That is the point of the twin parable he teaches about the tower builder and the king going to war – count the cost before beginning.

Luke makes it clear that Jesus had a large following among the common people. But unlike many popular leaders, Jesus did not measure discipleship in numbers but in the disciples’ willingness to place commitment to companionship with Jesus above all else.

Luke’s choice of strong language is significant. He chose the word “hate” to express the importance of a clear, absolute preference for following Jesus. The hatred mentioned in this gospel is not emotional hatred, the impulsive kind that erupts in a hurtful way. Rather, it is the willingness positively to see all precious relationships in the light of the priority to follow Jesus.

Jesus says that commitment is not comfortable. To be a disciple is to prefer following Jesus above all else, even above one’s own life. This preference can lead to separations, even divisions. Commitment is not easy. Did you know that Jesuit recruits are asked only one question to gain admittance to the Society: are you willing to be accounted as a fool with Christ foolish?

The message to the crowd following Jesus is that discipleship simply isn’t going to be popular. In fact, it can be spoken of in terms of a “cross,” the Roman method of execution.

Finally, the cost of discipleship is financial as well. Luke concludes by summarizing Jesus’ teaching in one sentence: Everyone who clings to possessions is not able to be a disciple.

The call to discipleship is no invitation to a life of prominence, ease, or enhanced social status. It is a call to treat all “possessions” as helping or hindering the goal of closer companionship with Jesus on


