# Wisdom from the Pews

Life is difficult right now. The news is full of wars, violence, economic uncertainty, and political strife. In times like these, it is easy to feel hopeless, to see only darkness.

In today's reading from Exodus, the Israelites were facing difficult times too. Amalek attacked Israel and threatened their very existence. Moses knew that the Lord would protect Israel, so he stood at the top of a hill holding up the staff of God as the battle began. Israel was winning at first, but then Moses' arms started to hurt. When Moses lowered his arms, the enemy advanced and Moses realized that he would need to keep his hands raised for the entire battle. Thankfully. Moses did not need to handle this challenge alone. God provided him with companions, Aaron and Hur, who held up Moses' hands when keeping them raised felt impossible. With the help of his friends. Moses was able to keep his hands raised until Israel defeated Amalek.



God does not want us to face challenging times alone either. For many years, I have longed for

They support each other, pray for each other, and love each other. No one person needs to lead this group alone because we have a community. We do not need to walk through life's challenges alone because we have each other.

Yes, life is difficult right now, but we have a God who is bigger than all of those difficulties. He sees our struggles, feels our pain, and offers us help in even the darkest of times. He provides us with companions to walk with us and to help us through our struggles. He provides us with a way out of the darkness and into the light.

You may have noticed the new ADA ramp for the church parking lot. The new ramp is to provide a safer entrance from the parking lot to the sidewalk, as

well as bringing it up to the current building code. Additionally, we now have a van accessible parking space. This is the first part of a plan to improve our ADA entrance with our goal to have a barrier free unassisted wheelchair entrance to the church.

The school is constantly changing with the ever-changing digital age. Slowly we have been replacing the old smart boards used for visual teaching aides to new high-definition video screens in the classrooms. This provides the teachers with many more tools and resources that are current to today's curriculum.

Thanks to the Archdiocese's Safety Grant program we were able to change out the old T8 fluorescent light bulbs to new LED light bulbs in Dillon Hall. This will cut our energy use for lighting in Dillon by half. Additionally, in the school, we were able to change out the classroom door hardware to new intruder protection hardware that is also ADA compliant.

#### ST. IGNATIUS SCHOOL

Our students recently took time to pray to the Examen together in class, with some grade levels choosing to partner up for the experience. The Examen is a simple, five-step prayer created by St. Ignatius of Lovola—our school's patron saint—as a way to pause, reflect on the day, and recognize where God is present in our lives. It offered a meaningful opportunity for students to slow down, reflect, and connect with their faith—and with one another.

Our 8th graders spent a meaningful day together in retreat at the Grotto. They reflected on our Jesuit and Holy Names heritage and what it means to carry those values forward as leaders at St. Ignatius. Students explored how they serve as role models and companions for the younger grades and how they can use those leadership skills to make a difference beyond our school community. The day included Mass at the Grotto and a special blessing to support them in their continued

leadership this year.





Many of our students have been putting their faith into action through meaningful service projects. Kindergarteners brought in food donations and delivered them to the St. Vincent de Paul Food Pantry at our parish offices. First graders helped care for our campus by doing a litter patrol



on the turf and playground. Second graders kicked off their letter-writing ministry, sending thoughtful notes to parishioners. Our fifth graders decorated lunch bags and assembled meals for Transition Projects.




