A Message from the Pastor

As we begin a calendar year and the liturgical year that features Matthew's gospel, we focus on two dimensions of discipleship. Those two dimensions are "call" and "light." Those who are called by Jesus, as a result of what they learn from the Teacher's words and actions, are sent to be "dispellers of darkness" or "lights to the world."

There is a song written by David Foster and made popular by Celine Dion. It is entitled "Love Lights the World." One of the verses of that song says:

No need to walk in the dark, we don't have to stand so far apart, every heart will grow when love lights up the world.

We just finished celebrating the Christmas season where we remember and give thanks for the powerful way that God's love became human and dwelt among us in Jesus Christ—the Light of the World. Because of this incredible incarnation of God's love, God redeemed and saved us. This continues to be, for most of us, too good to be true. But darkness and light are both part of our Christian faith and calling.

There is a lot of darkness in our world. Wherever people are hungry, there's darkness. Wherever people don't enjoy the basic freedoms of life, liberty



and the pursuit of happiness, there is darkness. Wherever young parents lose their child or families lose a beloved parent, grandparent, relative or friend to a terminal illness or fatal accident, there is darkness. Whenever people want employment and cannot find it, there is darkness. Whenever people who are mourning are not comforted by friends and community, there is darkness. Whenever people respond to the difficulties and conflict of life with violence rather than non-violence, there is darkness.

The "Good News" that we heard proclaimed during the Christmas Season and in our first scripture reading is this: "The people who dwelt in darkness have seen a great light."

How, then, do we live up to our call to be "lights to the world"? Whenever we face the awkwardness of not knowing what to say to a friend who has lost a loved one in order to offer them the comfort and support of our presence at the Wake or Funeral, we bring light to the world. Whenever we stand by a neighbor or colleague who is going through the painful breakup of a divorce, we bring light to the world. Whenever we find ways individually or collectively to support those looking for work or being put out of their homes or dealing with a difficult child, we bring light to the world. Whenever we are voice for the voiceless and power for the powerless, we bring light to the world. Whenever we have the courage to regularly visit the homebound and spend time with those who are dying, we bring light to the world. Whenever we commit ourselves to sharing our time and

talent and treasure with the faith community, we bring light to the world.





The Christopher Movement's motto is: "If everyone lit just one little candle, what a bright world this would be." Let's pray for one another that we may hear the call of Christ to each and every one of us to be "dispellers of darkness" and "lights to the world."

Ignatius invites us to contemplate the virtue of prudence which accompanies discernment and leads us to an openness to the Spirit. A Reflective Review of the Past Year: An Ignatian Annual Examen

St. Ignatius Loyola's Examen is an opportunity for peaceful daily reflective prayer. It invites us to find the movement of God in our life. The following is a reflective review of the past year.

Before you begin, identify some major markers of your year, such as those in the semester calendar [e.g., convocation, holidays, departmental retreats, commencement], or events [e.g., evaluations, conferences, meetings) to orient yourself to the full 12-month time period.

The Examen is simply a set of introspective prompts for you to follow or adapt to your own character and spirit. Begin with a pause and a slow, deep breath or two; become aware that you are in the presence of the Holy.

As I review the past 12 months, from a year ago through to the present moment -

What am I especially grateful for this year?

- An event that took place
- Courage that I mustered
- Love and support I received

I ask for the light to know God and to know myself as God sees me.

- Where have I felt true joy this year?
- · What troubled me this year?
- What has challenged me?
- Where and when did I find an opportunity for renewal and pause?

Have I noticed God's presence in any of this?

 In light of my review, what is my response to the God of my life?

As I look ahead, to the coming months what comes to mind?

 With what spirit do I want to enter the next few months, the next year?

I ask for God's presence and grace, for this spirit, as I enter the next year

In preschool the students are developing their fine motor skills making their own mitten creations. In kindergarten, the students led us in our school Mass and learned about St. John the Baptist. In first grade, students are practicing their addition skills and learning about cause and effect in reading. In second grade, students are learning two digit subtractions and the symbols of baptism. In third grade, students are studying fables and personification. Our fourth graders are exploring the interior valleys of Oregon. 


