Wisdom from the Pews

Today's Gospel presents a powerful lesson in the story of Jesus healing ten lepers. While all ten were healed, only one returned to offer thanks. The other nine, now free from their affliction, simply went on their way. We can only wonder what kept them from returning, but we know the one who did return was a person filled with a grateful heart.

This story prompts us to look

inward. Do we recognize and give thanks for God's countless blessings, or do we take them for granted? The truth is, most of us—the holy ones excluded—exhibit both responses. We can be genuinely grateful one moment and unknowingly ungrateful the next. It's a reflection of our imperfect, human nature.

This is why we come to the Eucharistic Celebration. The word "Eucharist" comes from the Greek word eucharistia, meaning "gratefulness" or "thanksgiving." It's a sacred time to glorify and give thanks to God. When we participate in Mass, we're not just observing; we're joining in a profound act of gratitude. We thank God for creation, for the daily bread that sustains us, and for the living Word that guides us. Most of all, we thank God for His Son, Jesus, who saves us from sin and offers us His Body and Blood that sustain us until we unite with God in heaven.

Next time you attend Mass, listen more closely. Pay attention to the lyrics as we sing the Gloria, and to the meaning in our unified cry of "Thanks be to God." Be especially attentive when the priest, in the name of the whole of the holy people, prays the Eucharistic Prayer, glorifying God the Father and giving thanks to Him for the entire work of salvation. When we participate with our whole hearts, we truly give thanks.

The challenge lies in whether we carry this grateful heart with us beyond the Mass. Just like the nine lepers, I'm often ungrateful. I can recall a few recent moments of ingratitude: one during a camping trip and another when I caught a cold just before visiting my parents. My lack of gratitude wasn't obvious at the time; these were subtle moments I only recognized later when I truly reflected on what it means to be grateful. My reflection reminded me that my moments of ingratitude are often in the things I take for granted.

But we don't have to settle for a life defined by an ungrateful heart. Cultivating gratitude is a conscious awareness, and as many spiritual traditions teach, it's a practice that transforms our relationships with God and with the world.



A powerful perspective on this comes from Thomas Merton, who writes in "Thoughts on Solitude" that gratitude is a direct recognition of divine love. He writes, "To be grateful is to recognize the Love of God in everything He has given us—and He has given us everything." This viewpoint frames every aspect of our existence, from each breath we take to every moment we experience, as a gift of God. For Merton, a truly grateful person doesn't just hear about God's goodness; they know it through personal experience. This experiential knowledge moves us from passive understanding to active appreciation.

While this practice of gratitude is a

personal journey, we don't have to rely solely on our own willpower. Prayer offers a way to ask for and receive divine assistance. As the psalmist prayed, "*Create in me a clean heart, O God*" (Psalm 51:10), we can adapt this to ask, "Create in me a grateful heart, O God." This act of prayer acknowledges our limitations and invites God to help us cultivate a grateful spirit.

Our 6th graders recently led us through a beautiful Mass. Our choir, made up of students in 4th through 8th grade, sang and played various instruments truly enhancing our faith experience as a whole school community.



Our University of Portland nurses visited several classrooms to teach a fun and educational handwashing lesson. Using a blacklight and special lotion that simulates germs, they showed students how well they washed their hands by having the students place their hands under the blacklight to reveal any missed spots—turning a simple lesson into a memorable, hands-on learning experience about the importance of proper



Our students are eagerly learning and serving others this fall. In third grade, students designed their own compass rose as they study the geography of our amazing Earth. In fourth grade, the students are learning about various natural disasters developing their critical thinking skills through a Venn diagram. Our fifth graders are learning about the 'power of yet' and working through challenges. Our 7th graders took their turn at packing our Transition Lunches this week. The artistically talented drawings on the bags definitely bring joy to the disadvantaged in our local community! Our 8th graders spent time this week in a Wind Up Toy Speed lab exploring how stored energy can be transferred into motion through a wind-up mechanism. Students practiced measuring speed, analyzing variables that affect motion, and

applying data to support their conclusions building their critical thinking skills in interpreting results. We are so proud of our young Gators in their quest for knowledge!




