A Message from the Pastor


Jesuit John Donahue reminds us that the paradox of the cross is captured on Palm Sunday. Jesus enters Jerusalem with royal acclamation, not astride a horse but "meek and riding on an ass," a symbol of peace, not war. At the end of this week, a placard on the cross proclaims him king in the truest sense, one who rules by self-giving, one who wins by losing.

Today marks the beginning of what we call Holy Week. Until Thursday night at 7:00pm in St. Ignatius Parish it is Lent. Then, on Thursday evening at 7:00pm, we begin to wade deeply into the paschal mystery. Thursday evening we celebrate the institution of the Eucharist and how it calls us to a service that imitates the Teacher. Friday evening at 7:00pm we will remember the extent of God's love in Christ by commemorating the events and significance of Christ's passion and death. Saturday evening at 8:30pm we will joyfully welcome the candidates into our faith community and celebrate love's triumph over death: the bright promise of resurrection.

During this sacred triduum, these days are so holy that there is only one service each day. Please make an extra special effort to join us Thursday, Friday evenings at 7:00pm and Saturday evening at 8:30pm.

This weekend we will hear the proclamation of the Passion according to St. Luke. With Christ on the cross this year are those who gave their lives trying to save others—all those men and women who put their lives at risk in order to keep us safe and healthy during this prolonged pandemic.

Also on the cross are those whose lives were simply snatched as a result of Russia's invasion of Ukraine. Luke's Passion reminds us of those people who seek justice by speaking out on behalf of the poor and the marginalized and who unmask the hidden structures of evil, often at the cost of their own lives.

In an essay entitled "The Rose Garden," Jesuit Jon Sobrino describes a garden that was carefully tended by Obdulio, husband of Elba, who was killed along with her daughter Celina and six Jesuits in El Salvador in November 1989. He speaks of the need to keep alive the joyful and subversive memory of the cross and says that Christians must unite "against that part of the cross which is sin, and in support of that part of the cross which is joy."

As we enter the events of this Holy Week, let us pray in the words of Jay Cormier:

Christ our Redeemer, may we not only remember your passion, death and resurrection this Holy Week, but may we enter, heart and soul, into your passion, death and resurrection. May the example of your selfless compassion guide our faltering steps as we struggle to follow you from Jerusalem to the upper room, from agony to trial, from crucifixion to burial. May we empty ourselves of our own hurts and wants in order to become lights of your mercy and consolation for others; may we take up our crosses as you took up yours in the certain hope that our experiences of crucifixion for the sake of justice and integrity

will be transformed into the vindication of Easter, Amen.





We are blessed to finally return to in person school Masses planned by grade level classes. As we ease back into school Masses, some grade levels attend in person while the remaining classes view the Mass live via Zoom. The classes leading the Masses have done a wonderful job speaking clearly and leading our school as we deepen our faith during this Lenten season.

Our students are busy actively learning and growing. All grade levels are deepening their understanding of Palm Sunday as we prepare to enter Holy Week. Our preschoolers are explor-

ing crawling creatures, rocks and shells, and creating beautiful works of art through painting, drawing, cutting and pasting. Our kindergarteners are studying 3D shapes. First graders are learning about coins. Second graders are learning about the effects of wind and the water cycle. Our third graders built three dimensional paper animal habitats. Fourth graders are tackling decimals in math and excitedly playing their recorders outside at recess. Our fifth through eighth graders are learning badminton in PE. Our middle school students learned about famous women for Women's History month. Sixth graders created slideshow presentations for their literature circle novels and are beginning their science fair projects. Seventh graders have begun working on their 'notable' person project for the Night of the Notables and are learning about volcanoes. Our eighth graders worked on a population change simulation for buffalo in the Serengeti.
