SATURDAY: 8:00 AM First Saturday Mass



<u>Pastor's Message</u> Come for the Pasta – Stay for the Friends

Dear Parishioners and Friends:



This is Italian Dinner weekend at the parish – the 85th anniversary celebration of meatballs and ravioli, our Italian heritage, and friends and family who come from across the city for an annual reunion. It's also President's Day holiday weekend, and the announcement of the Archbishop's Catholic Appeal. It's a joyful time to appreciate the vibrant buzz of parish life.

The weekend scriptures confront the meaning of the law – whether your holiness comes from keeping the law, or from living the spirit that animates the law.

When Jesus says that he has come not to abolish but to fulfill the law, it means that he is not dismissing the Old Testament – but re-interpreting it. Jesus challenges his followers to go beyond a minimal observance of the law – and undertake the underlying values embedded in the law with renewed vigor. He wants his hearers to get in touch with the spirit of the Torah, the interior dispositions that are needed to match God's covenant love.

What are the demands of covenant love? In Matthew, Jesus teaches that the law against murder includes hatred, scorn, and litigiousness. The law against adultery speaks to the responsibilities of men and women alike, as well as about lustful desires and scandal. The law concerning divorce includes fewer exceptions than what Moses allowed. The law against false oaths holds up the ideal of transparent integrity, such that "Yes" always means "Yes," and "No" is always "No."

Pastor's Message Continued...

Jesus does not abrogate the prohibition against murder. Rather, he focuses on the root cause of murder, which is anger. If you deal constructively with your anger, then murder will be averted. In the same way, the root cause of adultery is lust – the powerful energy of sexual attraction and the desire to use another for pleasurable gratification. If you allow lust to have full sway, then adultery is a possible outcome. But if lust is held in check, adultery will not become a viable option. In all this, Jesus is calling his audience to grow in the spirit of Torah – law as an expression of covenant love.

For Christians, more is expected of those committed to Christ than adherence to the law. For example, Moses permitted divorce for various causes, but the Christian community was to have tougher standards. Christian community is the set of relationships where the mutual faithfulness between God and people is celebrated by radical commitment. So, too, oaths and swearing are redundant for Christians committed to trustworthiness.

What does all this mean for us today? It means that our call is to be a community that avoids violence, oppression, unfaithfulness and dishonesty. It means that others will know us by our peace, reverence, responsibility, and mutual care. Our call is to be a people driven by love, a people who are responsible as Jesus was responsible.

Let me end with a story. A young boy was walking through the park after attending a Sunday school class. Somehow he couldn't stop thinking about the lesson of that day about Jesus' parable of the last judgment. What impressed him most was when the catechist said, "When you give something to another person, you're really giving it to Jesus."

As he continued through the park, he noticed an old woman sitting on a bench. She looked lonely and hungry. So he sat down next to her, took from his pocket a chocolate bar he had been saving, and offered some to her. She accepted it with a smile. He liked her smile so much that after she had eaten her piece of chocolate, he gave her more. This time they exchanged smiles, and for a while, they sat together in silence, just smiling at each other.

Finally, the boy got up to leave. As he began to walk away, he turned, ran back to the bench, and gave the woman a big hug. And she gave him her very best smile. When he arrived home, his mother saw a big smile on his face and asked, "What made you so happy today?" He said, "I shared my chocolate bar with Jesus. And she has a great smile."

Meanwhile the old woman returned to her little apartment where she lived with her sister. "You're all smiles," said the sister. "What made you so happy today?" To which she replied, "I was sitting in the park, eating a chocolate bar with Jesus. And you know, he looks a lot younger than I expected."


