A Message from the Pastor


What is it that makes your life rich? Probably what you give away, not what you hang onto.

Philosopher Francis Bacon, playwright Thornton Wilder, and American Musical character Dolly Levi are all credited with this saying about money or material things. "Money is like manure—when you pile it up, it begins to stink. When you spread it around, it can do a lot of good." What do we stockpile or hoard in our life? As Qoheleth reminds us, "Vanity of vanity and all things are vanity." We can pile our stuff up, but we can't take it with us.

That was the focus of the Medieval Morality Play entitled *Everyman*. Death comes for everyone. In this play, Death comes for Everyman, who wants to take someone or something with him. But he can't take beauty with him. He can't take the honors he has achieved with him. The only thing he can take with him to Judgement are his good deeds—the good he did with the blessings he was given in life. That was true in the Middle Ages and it is true today. It is true for your pastor. It is true for Pope Francis. It was true for St. Ignatius Loyola. It was true for Mother Teresa. And it will be true for each and every one of you.

What is it that makes your life rich? Probably what you give away, not what you hang onto.

This weekend's scriptures invite us to think realistically about "earthly things," about vanities, about bigger barns and storage facilities. Victor Frankl, World War II concentration camp survivor and psychiatrist, invited people to picture themselves on their deathbed and to ask from there how they had given meaning to the one life they had received. That is a way to begin to learn "to count our days aright."



Whether we picture our deathbed, remember the value of a generous deed, think about the futility of a dead man's big barns, or simply sit to appreciate the beauty and grandeur of nature, these August days, we are about to enter, are made for more than busyness and stuff.

John Wesley was the founder of Methodism and author of countless worship hymns. His rule of life was to save all he could and give all he could. He once encouraged his congregation, "Do all the good you can, by all the means you can, in all the ways you can, at all the times you can, to all the people you can, as long as you ever can." God of every good thing, instill in us a spirit of poverty— not an austere hatred for the things of the world but an appreciation for the many gifts you have given us and a commitment to use what you have given us to establish your reign of compassion and forgiveness, of justice and peace.

Fill our homes with joy and love; fill our barns with an unending capacity for generosity and kindness to all who come to our door or table.
