Rejoice in the Lord

Dear Parishioners:

Today is *Gaudete* Sunday, the third Sunday in Advent named after the Latin imperative *Rejoice!* The color of the candle on the Advent wreath and the liturgical vestments is rose-colored – to signal a special joy – that when Christ comes, the world will treat everyone with respect and everywhere there will be peace. We are joyful because Jesus promises a new world where God’s desires for blessing will prevail over selfishness and divisions.

Anointing of the Sick at all of this weekend’s Masses is one significant source of joy. Emmanuel is almost tangibly felt within the community when the circle of parishioners surrounds the one being anointed, and like the Lord touching those he healed, we hold the one at the center of our prayer for healing. All those anointed are *healed* – of anxiety, discouragement or unbelief. And some are *cured* – if the return of their strength and health is for their spiritual betterment and the blessing of their faith community.

Today’s gospel features John the Baptist in a prison cell. Earlier the gospel had shown John as brave and popular and in charge, and people flocking to him and hanging on his every word. But now things are different. No crowds, no affirmations, no Messiah nearby to point to. And plenty of time to think.

John had announced that the Messiah has come. But now as he gazed through his prison bars, where’s all the Messiah confidence? Where’s the peaceable kingdom? The blooming desert? Reconciliation, tolerance, brotherhood? You see him begin to face all of the difficulties. Had he backed the wrong horse? Was it all an illusion? Had Jesus made a difference?

John’s questions seem so contemporary. In our era of turmoil in the church and in our political discourse, where is the Messiah and the peace he came to bring? In Matthew’s gospel, Jesus senses John’s temptation to cynicism – and perhaps our own – and sympathetically responds.

Jesus sends the message to the prisoner that says, in effect, “Listen, John, you may be looking for the Messiah in all the wrong places. I’m not what you expected, and not what people wanted. I’m not a celebrity survivor, a warrior to slay dissidents, or a master to impose conformity and servitude. I have not come for domination and conquest to enforce virtue and wipe out evil. You won’t find me in the halls of power. Remember, I was born in a stable.”

“But, I tell you, you will find me wherever someone helps the blind to see, the lame to walk, the sick to heal, the deaf to hear, the spiritually dead to rise, and the poor to better their lives. And blessed are the ones who take no offense at my doing it this way.”

That’s where the Messiah is. And blessed are those who know this, and minister to Jesus in the least of his little ones, and thereby reveal the Messianic presence. When people are still asking where the Messiah is, perhaps it’s because not enough believers reveal him through their lives.

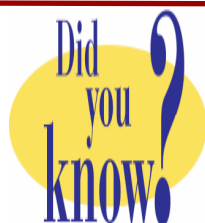

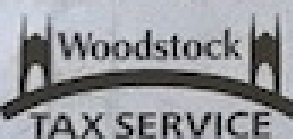
