### *Wisdom from the Pews*

I recognize that I am in a unique position to write Wisdom from the Pews. Each week, as a second-grade teacher, I have the privilege of walking with my students through the Sunday readings and helping them discover the simple, lasting message God wants them to carry in their lives. In guiding these young hearts, I am often reminded that wisdom does not always come from age, but from listening closely and trusting what God reveals. It is from this perspective—shaped by the faith of children and the lessons they continually teach me—that I share today's reflection.

The Gospel this week, which tells the story of Jesus's baptism, might inspire all of us to remember our own baptism. Each year in the primary grades, we talk about baptism and share our baptism stories. I share my unique

story, because I was baptized on May 18, 1980. I challenge them to go home and find out what made that day so special. As many of you may know, that was the day Mount St. Helens erupted—almost forty-six years ago—while I, just three weeks old, was baptized here at St. Ignatius Church. I remain deeply grateful to my parents, Bob Hasibar and Madeline Gefroh, for choosing to raise my siblings and me in the Catholic faith, and specifically, within this Jesuit parish.

In this Gospel, Jesus—who has no need of baptism—steps into the water anyway. He does not insist on status or privilege. Instead, He stands alongside others. In this moment, we see that true greatness is shown through humility. When we choose to stand with others rather than above them, God can work powerfully through us.

## PARISH PROGRAMMING

### *Wisdom from the Pews* (Continued)

The Jordan River itself is not a grand or impressive place. Baptism is a simple act. And yet, it is there that heaven opens. This reminds us that God often reveals Himself not in dramatic moments, but in quiet faithfulness—in daily prayer, loving service, and simply showing up, even when it is hard.

Jesus's baptism also takes place before He performs any miracles or begins His public ministry. Before He does anything, God speaks: ***"You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."*** This is an important reminder for all of us—especially caregivers, teachers, and leaders who so often measure themselves by how much they do—that we are loved not because of what or how much we accomplish, but because of who we are.

Finally, the Spirit descends upon Jesus as He begins something difficult. God never sends us forward without also giving us the grace we need. Whatever lies ahead may be challenging or uncertain, but we are not sent alone. The same Spirit that descended upon Jesus at the Jordan River goes with us on our own journeys, reminding us that we are God's beloved.

As we remember Jesus standing in the waters of the Jordan, we are invited to return—again and again—to the waters of our own baptism. Long before we prove ourselves, before we get it right, before we know where the path will lead, God speaks the same words over each of us: You are my beloved. May we live from that truth, with the humility of Jesus, the trust of a child, and the quiet courage to keep showing up—confident that the Spirit goes with us, now and always.




