A Message from the Pastor

I once watched a remarkable foreign film (Swedish with English subtitles). The title of the film was *“As It Is in Heaven.”* A young, sensitive, and musically gifted boy is continually bullied in a remote Swedish Village. His mother, for the ongoing safety and health of her child, moves to a larger city in Sweden. The boy grows up and becomes a virtuoso Violin Player and internationally acclaimed musical director. After suffering a heart attack, because of his demanding schedule, he moves back to his childhood village and buys the old schoolhouse.

The village has a local choir that, on a good day, is simply horrible. The locals, aware of Daniel’s reputation, ask him to listen to them and make suggestions. His response is, “I just came here to listen.” Eventually he agrees to be the Choir Director and in his first meeting with them he tells them: “Everything begins with listening. Each person has their own unique tone, their own individual tone. Try and find yours.”

Listening becomes the primary metaphor of life in this village. Before Daniel returned to his childhood village, the inhabitants had not really listened to one another’s pain or suffering, hopes and fears, joys and disappointments. They were deaf to one another. As Daniel gradually teaches them to “find their own tone,” he frees them to listen to their hearts, their minds, their bodies, their hopes and their dreams. By helping the villagers truly listen, they discover how “to take down the music that has always been there” and make it their own. In doing this, they find new freedom and joy and life.

Were you able to listen to the good news of the scripture readings today? Did you hear God say, in our first reading, “Like a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you,” says the Lord? Hopefully, that is music to our

ears. God wants nothing more than to comfort and console us in our struggles, in our successes and failures, in our dreams and disappointments, in our striving to be good people and lead good lives.

Were you able to listen and hear the excitement of the disciples in our gospel today when they returned to Jesus and shared with him all that they had done in his name? Did you hear Jesus tell them to rejoice not so much in the great things they accomplished as in the fact that their names were written in the Book of Life? Can we imagine Jesus saying that to each and every one of us in the St. Ignatius Loyola faith family? "Rejoice, my friends, because your names are written in the Book of Life. That is what you were created for. That is what I have called you to. That is the destination of your life's journey in faith." Hopefully, that too is music to our ears---if we can hear it. And if we can hear it, this music will free us and fill us with great joy.



But it will also do more. As we discover our tone, our song, it will also help us to listen to the tones and songs of others. It will free us to discover how much we have in common with them. It will help us become compassionate listeners and wounded healers. It will free us to hear what the poor and the hungry and the homeless are saying or singing to us through their often painful and sorrowful songs. It will help us to listen with compassion to the songs of all those who would like to work and presently don't have the opportunity. It will help us to listen carefully to the songs of the innocent victims of violence whether that violence is found in a foreign war or a domestic relationship. It will free us to look for what harmonizes and unites us rather than for what separates and divides us. In the harmony of a choir, there is no "us" and "them." In the harmony of a choir, we all unite our unique tone into one song.

So let us pray for one another on this Fourth of July Weekend.



Lord God, you are both the road we follow and the destination of our journey. With grace as our travel bag and peace as our walking stick, may we discover your love and healing along the way. Teach us to be attentive listeners. Help us discover the tone, the song you have given to each of us. Help us to work and sing and live in harmony. By the compassionate listening we are able to offer, may we cast out the demons of fear and discord that divide us. May we become seeds of your peace, your love, and your life in our homes, in our schools, in our parish, and in our world. We ask this of you, the giver of song, now and forever. Amen.


