Wisdom from the Pews

Genesis 2:7-9; 3:1-7
Romans 5:12-19
Matthew 4:1-11



The story of Eden is probably the first story many of us heard as children about how God created human life and how we God gave us paradise. It is also the story of temptation getting the better of us that led to disobedience - the loss of perfection and innocence, and the owning of “original sin.” We discovered human good and evil, and attempted to clothe ourselves to hide our imperfection, the shame of knowing that there is good and bad in us.

As I grew older and began to question the meaning of original sin, of our imperfection, I fought it for a long time. I realized now that it was how the message was sent with the emphasis that we were somehow born bad. It made my stomach turn. So, I embarked on a search for answers. I read the teachings of many scholars and thinkers. I spoke to mentors and teachers. I read and pondered endlessly. I am grateful for good influences in my life such as St Augustine, Thomas Merton, and Mother Teresa.

even when I was as young as 5 years old. The message was always about human imperfection, of good and evil, our conscience, and of the importance of making moral decisions.

Our imperfection, original sin as such, is a humbling reality. It is, however, in appreciating the lesser things of which we are capable that points us to the importance of love and good. Even then, simply doing good is no easy task, for inadvertently, our good intentions can do harm to others. Do we then become paralyzed, and not work on doing good? No, it is about giving up our ego, thinking that we have the answer, and learning to seek God’s guidance in our lives and actions. For we are imperfect, capable of good and evil, and there is no hiding from our naked selves.

It took a while, but I finally recognized that my journey to accepting our imperfection was about eating the forbidden fruit, of discovering good and evil. And this journey of discovery is shared by all—part of growing up, losing our innocence, maturing, appreciating that we are imperfect, and the importance of making moral decisions. I did not understand the connection to the story of Eden when I was young, but I look back now to the lessons my parents taught, and I appreciate now the connection of eating the apple in Eden to being born imperfect. I recall, for example, of the simple act of sharing at the beginning of every school year where we would have to give up one item of our school supplies be it a pencil, notebook, or eraser, and to share it with students who are less fortunate. Or how my sisters and I had to watch, with my parents, the 5pm BBC World News, with all the suffering in the world,

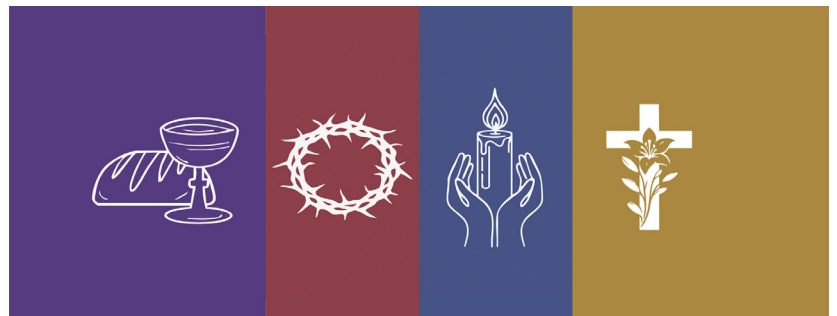

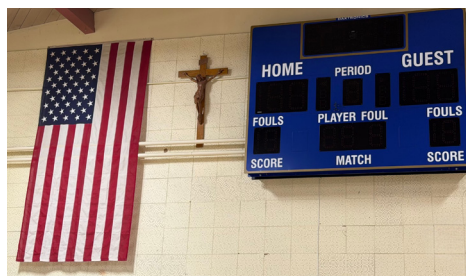
